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RESOLUTION 2023-15

A RESOLUTION MAKING CERTAIN FINDINGS, AND APPROVING AND AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF AN AMENDED AND RESTATED ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT ("AGREEMENT") BETWEEN THE CITY OF JACKSONVILLE ("CITY") AND FLEXCOLD, LLC AND 11180 BLASIUS ROAD, LLC (COLLECTIVELY, THE "COMPANY"), TO SUPPORT THE CREATION OF COMPANY'S OPERATIONS AT A NEW FACILITY LOCATED AT GENERALLY AT 11180 BLASIUS ROAD WITHIN THE CITY ("PROJECT"); AUTHORIZING A REVISED FIVE-YEAR RECAPTURE ENHANCED VALUE (REV) GRANT IN THE MAXIMUM AMOUNT OF \$2,500,000, WHICH INCREASES THE MAXIMUM AMOUNT THEREOF BY \$1,400,000; APPROVING AND AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF DOCUMENTS BY THE MAYOR, OR HIS DESIGNEE, AND CORPORATION SECRETARY; AUTHORIZING APPROVAL OF TECHNICAL AMENDMENTS BY THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE OFFICE OF ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT ("OED"); PROVIDING FOR OVERSIGHT BY THE OED; PROVIDING A DEADLINE FOR THE COMPANY TO EXECUTE AGREEMENT; AFFIRMING THE PROJECT'S COMPLIANCE WITH THE PUBLIC INVESTMENT POLICY ADOPTED BY ORDINANCE 2022-372-E, AS AMENDED; REQUESTING TWO-READING PASSAGE PURSUANT TO COUNCIL RULE 3.305; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

Road, LLC ("Blasius") have previously entered into that certain Economic Development Agreement dated June 21, 2021 as authorized by Resolution 2021-187-A ("Prior Agreement"), pursuant to which Blasius was to establish a refrigerated processing, warehousing and storage facility with an estimated capital investment of \$47,000,000, with 20 new jobs created, and the City was to provide a \$1,100,000 REV Grant related thereto; and

WHEREAS, the scope of the project has increased and Blasius has requested to amend and restate the Prior Agreement to: (i) add an additional 196,000 square feet to the under-construction cold storage facility, to a total of 346,000 square feet, and purchase of additional machinery and equipment, with a correlating increase in capital investment from \$47,000,000 to an estimated total capital investment of \$115,000,000; (ii) increase the number of New Jobs from 20 to 40, extending the job creation schedule for an additional two years, to December 31, 2025, and increase the average wage from \$51,192 to \$55,422; (iii) extend the construction completion date for an additional year, to December 31, 2024; (iv) increase the REV Grant maximum amount from \$1,100,000 to \$2,500,000; and (v) add Flexcold, LLC ("Flexcold") as a party to the Amended and Restated Agreement, with all other terms and conditions remaining unchanged; and

WHEREAS, such average salary is equal to 100% of the average private-sector wage in the State effective as of January 1, 2022; and WHEREAS, for the reasons more fully described in the Project Summary, the payment of the REV Grant in such amounts serves a paramount public purpose; and

WHEREAS, the OED has reviewed the application submitted by Flexcold and Blasius (collectively, the "Company") for community development; and, together with representatives of the City, negotiated the Amended and Restated Agreement. Accordingly, based upon the contents of the Amended and Restated Agreement, it has been

determined that the Amended and Restated Agreement and the uses contemplated therein to be in the public interest, and that the public actions and financial assistance contemplated in the Amended and Restated Agreement take into account and give consideration to the long-term public interests and public interest benefits to be achieved by the City; and

WHEREAS, the Company has requested the City to enter into the Amended and Restated Agreement in substantially the form placed On File with the Office of Legislative Services; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Findings. It is hereby ascertained, determined, found and declared as follows:

- (a) The recitals set forth herein are true and correct.
- (b) The location of the Company's Project in Jacksonville, Florida, is more particularly described in the Agreement. The Project will promote and further the public and municipal purposes of the City.
- (c) Enhancement of the City's tax base and revenues, are matters of State and City policy and State and City concern in order that the State and its counties and municipalities, including the City, shall not continue to be endangered by unemployment, underemployment, economic recession, poverty, crime and disease, and consume an excessive proportion of the State and City revenues because of the extra services required for police, fire, accident, health care, elderly care, charity care, hospitalization, public housing and housing assistance, and other forms of public protection, services and facilities.
- (d) The provision of the City's assistance as identified in the Agreement is necessary and appropriate to make the Project feasible; and the City's assistance is reasonable and not excessive, taking into account the needs of the Company to make the Project economically

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- (e) The Company is qualified to carry out and complete the construction and equipping of the Project, in accordance with the Agreement.
- (f) The authorizations provided by this Resolution are for public uses and purposes for which the City may use its powers as a county, municipality and as a political subdivision of the State of Florida and may expend public funds, and the necessity in the public interest for the provisions herein enacted is hereby declared as a matter of legislative determination.
- (g) This Resolution is adopted pursuant to the provisions of Chapters 163, 166 and 125, Florida Statutes, as amended, the City's Charter, and other applicable provisions of law.

Economic Section 2. Amended and Restated Development Agreement Approved. There is hereby approved, and the Mayor and Corporation Secretary are authorized to execute and deliver, for and on behalf of the City, an amended and restated agreement between the City and the Company, substantially in the form placed On File with the Office of Legislative Services (with such "technical" changes as herein authorized), for the purpose of implementing the recommendations of the OED, as are further described in the Project Summary attached hereto as Exhibit 1.

The Amended and Restated Agreement may include such additions, deletions and changes as may be reasonable, necessary and incidental for carrying out the purposes thereof, as may be acceptable to the Mayor, or his designee, with such inclusion and acceptance being evidenced by execution of the Agreement by the Mayor or his designee. No modification to the Amended and Restated Agreement may increase the financial obligations or the liability of the City and any such

modification shall be technical only and shall be subject to appropriate legal review and approval of the General Counsel, or his or her designee, and all other appropriate action required by law. "Technical" is herein defined as including, but not limited to, changes in legal descriptions and surveys, descriptions of infrastructure improvements and/or any road project, ingress and egress, easements and rights of way, performance schedules (provided that no performance schedule may be extended for more than one year without City Council approval) design standards, access and site plan, which have no financial impact.

Section 3. Payment of REV Grant.

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(a) The REV Grant shall not be deemed to constitute a debt, liability, or obligation of the City or of the State of Florida or any political subdivision thereof within the meaning of constitutional or statutory limitation, or a pledge of the faith and credit or taxing power of the City or of the State of Florida or any political subdivision thereof, but shall be payable solely from the funds provided therefor as provided in this Section. The Amended and Restated Agreement shall contain a statement to the effect that the City shall not be obligated to pay any installment of its financial assistance to the Company except from the non-ad valorem revenues or other legally available funds provided for that purpose, that neither the faith and credit nor the taxing power of the City or of the State of Florida or any political subdivision thereof is pledged to the payment of any portion of such financial assistance, and that the Company, or any person, firm or entity claiming by, through or under the Company, or any other person whomsoever, shall never have any right, directly or indirectly, to compel the exercise of the ad valorem taxing power of the City or of the State of Florida or any political subdivision thereof for the payment of any portion of such financial assistance.

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(b) The Mayor, or his designee, is hereby authorized to and shall disburse the annual installments of the REV Grant as provided in this Section in accordance with this Resolution and the Amended and Restated Agreement.

Designation of Authorized Official/OED Contract Section 4. The Mayor is designated as the authorized official of the City for the purpose of executing and delivering any contracts and documents and furnishing such information, data and documents for the Amended and Restated Agreement and related documents as may be required and otherwise to act as the authorized official of the City in connection with the Amended and Restated Agreement, and is further authorized to designate one or more other officials of the City to exercise any of the foregoing authorizations and to furnish or cause to be furnished such information and take or cause to be taken such action as may be necessary to enable the City to implement the Amended and Restated Agreement according to its terms. The OED is hereby required to administer and monitor the Amended and Restated Agreement and to handle the City's responsibilities thereunder, including the City's responsibilities under such Amended and Restated Agreement working with and supported by all relevant City departments.

Section 5. Further Authorizations. The Mayor, or his designee, and the Corporation Secretary, are hereby authorized to execute and deliver the Amended and Restated Agreement and all other contracts and documents and otherwise take all necessary action in connection therewith and herewith. The Executive Director of the OED, as contract administrator, is authorized to negotiate and execute all necessary changes and amendments to the Amended and Restated Agreement and other contracts and documents, to effectuate the purposes of this Resolution, without further Council action, provided such changes and amendments are limited to amendments that are technical in nature (as described in Section 2 hereof), and further provided that all such

amendments shall be subject to appropriate legal review and approval by the General Counsel, or his or her designee, and all other appropriate official action required by law.

Section 6. Oversight Department. The OED shall oversee the Project described herein.

Section 7. Execution of Amended and Restated Agreement. If the Amended and Restated Agreement approved by this Resolution has not been signed by the Company within ninety (90) days after the OED delivers or mails the unexecuted Amended and Restated Agreement to the Company for execution, then the City Council approvals in this Resolution and authorization for the Mayor to execute the Amended and Restated Agreement are automatically revoked; provided, however, that the Executive Director of the OED shall have the authority to extend such ninety (90) day period in writing at his discretion for up to an additional ninety (90) days.

Section 8. Public Investment Policy. This Resolution conforms to the guidelines provided in the Public Investment Policy most recently adopted by City Council Ordinance 2022-372-E, as amended.

Section 9. Requesting Two Reading Passage Pursuant to Council Rule 3.305. Two reading passage of this legislation is requested pursuant to Council Rule 3.305.

Section 10. Effective Date. This Resolution shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
