A RESOLUTION HONORING AND COMMEMORATING THE LIFE AND COUNTLESS ACCOMPLISHMENTS OF FORMER CITY COUNCIL MEMBER AND STATE REPRESENTATIVE EVELYN DENISE LEE; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Evelyn Denise Lee, a Jacksonville native and daughter of John Henry Lee, a World War II Veteran and Sleeping Car Porter, and the former Leanora Daniels, a teacher, attended Duval County Public Schools and attended Florida Agricultural and Mechanical University; and

WHEREAS, Ms. Lee was drawn to electoral politics from an early age and spent most of her life involved in campaigns, elections and governance, working on or managing the campaigns of a long list of Democratic candidates at the local, state and national level; and

WHEREAS, her own entry into political office came in September of 1982 when she was selected by the City Council to fill a vacancy on the body caused by the death of the legendary Council Member Sallye Mathis. She subsequently won her election for a first full term in 1983 and thereafter was re-elected to represent District 8 in 1987, 1991 and 1995, leaving office in 1999 due to the imposition of a twoterm limit on Council Members several years earlier; and

28 WHEREAS, in November of 1999 Ms. Lee was elected to represent 29 District 15 of the Florida House of Representatives to fill a vacancy 30 left by the resignation of State Representative Wyllie Frank Clayton 31 Dennis and was re-elected to a full term for 2000-2002. In 2007, she 1 was once again elected to the City Council and re-elected in 2011, 2 leaving office again due to term limits in 2015 after serving a total 3 of 25 years on the Jacksonville City Council, the second longest 4 tenure in the consolidated government era following only Council 5 Member Warren Anthony Jones who served for 28 years; and

WHEREAS, throughout her years in public office, Ms. Lee carried 6 7 a well-earned reputation as a tireless and tenacious advocate for her 8 constituents and her District, especially for those in most need of 9 assistance and attention to their issues. She consistently sought and 10 won the resources needed to improve conditions in her District, seeking capital project funding and programmatic attention from City 11 12 and state departments to ensure that equal resources were provided 13 to all communities. She was especially passionate about fighting blight and deterioration both in her district and throughout the city 14 15 as a fundamental way to improve the perception of neighborhoods as good places to live and work and to increase the self-esteem and 16 17 pride of the residents of those neighborhoods; and

18 WHEREAS, throughout her lifetime and her decades of public 19 service, Ms. Lee was a passionate representative for her constituents' 20 needs and a formidable advocate for the under-represented, as well 21 as a loyal friend; her passion and dedication to service will long 22 be remembered; now therefore
