Presentation on Foreclosure Registry Fund

Council Auditor Kim Taylor to discuss General Fund/General Services District FY 2023/24 Recapture

Ms. Taylor, Council Auditor, provided a report on the annual recapture of General Fund/General Services District monies from GF/GSD Supported Operating Funds. She said there are two negative cash funds, Special Events and Cecil Field Commerce Center.

Per the Auditor's handout, the recaptured funds will be designated as committed by the City Council per Section 11. 7 of the 2023-504-E Budget Ordinance:

- 1) \$ 540,410 from Property Appraiser
- 2) \$ 724,296 from Kids Hope Alliance
- 3) \$3,715,580 from Public Building Allocation

In addition to the above, the Auditor's Office is recommending a reduction in the General Fund loan extended to Solid Waste Disposal fund 43101 in FY2023 in the amount of \$3,000,000 due to strong operating performance which obviates the need for this portion of the approved loan amount (Total Positive Impact: \$7,980,286).

Brittany Norris, Mayor;s Office, provided an update on homeless services at the Beaches. She said that there has been a slight uptick in the homeless population at the beach. Ms. Norris said she has coordinated with the Beaches mayors regarding involvement in the Homeward Bound program, and with Mission House regarding services. Council Member Diamond offered to assist with Mission House to garner private sector financial support.

Mr. Peterson, Auditor's Office, explained the amendment. Approved unanimously.

There was a lengthy back and forth discussion among the committee members and Mr. Fackler, General Counsel, related to how, per Charter, the General Counsel serves the entirety of the consolidated government. Council Member Diamond expressed a lack of trust in Mr. Fackler's legal representation. Council Member Freeman mentioned an issue in 2023 with the previous candidate for the General Counsel position and the state Ethics Commission. The committee talked about fairness in OGC opinions. Council Member Howland offered a floor amendment to remove the language in the bill about poor morale in the General Counsel's Office. Approved 4-2 (Diamond and Pittman in opposition)

Council Member Diamond spoke in opposition to using funds from the JEA contribution for this transaction. He said that JEA should decrease their rates and rebate customers.

Kurt Wilson, JEA, said that the increase in contribution to the City did not come from a rate increase but from debt restructuring. He noted that the 7% contribution has been the same since the 1970's.

Council Member Freeman said he will equally consider this bill and a City purchase of the parcel, and the proposed land swap with Gateway.
