Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 1 is to provide funding for various programs and activities aimed at preventing and controlling crime and improving public safety throughout Duval County. A portion of these funds will be used to support the City's DAWN (Developing Adults With Necessary Skills) and The DAWN program provides General Education InVEST programs. Development (GED) and adult basic education instruction, life skills training, and transitional counseling classes to adults aged 18 and over who are incarcerated in Jacksonville Sheriff's Office facilities. The InVEST program provides assistance to victims of In addition, the grant funds will be used to domestic violence. support contract management and monitoring personnel for the City's crime prevention, intervention, correction, rehabilitation education programs.
