Council Member Johnson explained the bill and the workforce development program. He offered a floor amendment to prohibit this appropriation from counting towards the City's contribution in the CBA. After discussion, it was clarified that this legislation pre-dates the CBA and as such may not be considered as a part of it. Council Member withdrew his floor amendment.

Council Member Miller asked questions about duplicity with other workforce training programs. Council Member Johnson explained the benefit of wraparound services, especially childcare and transportation assistance.

David Rey and Naomi Jackson, Goodwill, described the components of the program, such as GED and ESOL classes, OSHA certification and re-entry outreach. Council Member Freeman asked about the BOOST program and Mr. Rey said they will be looking to partner with that entity as well. Mr. Rey said that this is one time funding from the City.

Council Member Howland noted that \$150,000 of this appropriation will go towards housing assistance for emergency rental needs and eviction diversion.

Trista Carraher explained the Auditor's amendment. Approved unanimously.

Council Member Howland explained the bill and the reasoning for the historic marker honoring the life of Mrs. Chappell. Near the intersection of New Kings Road and Flicker Avenue in Council District 10, on the evening of March 23, 1964, during a month marked by racial violence in Jacksonville, Mrs. Johnnie Mae Chappell was targeted by four men and shot by one of them due to the color of her skin. He proposed a floor amendment to change the wording of the marker to reflect changes recommended by the Chappell family.

With the Howland floor amendment, the marker will state: "This marker stands as a solemn tribute to Mrs. Johnnie Mae Chappell, whose life was tragically taken on the evening of March 23, 1964, amid a period of racial violence in Jacksonville. While searching for her lost wallet at this location, Mrs. Chappell was targeted by four men in a passing vehicle. One of the men, motivated by racial hatred, fatally shot Mrs. Chappell simply because of the color of her skin. Despite the heinous nature of the crime, the case remained unsolved for several months. When it was finally prosecuted, the perpetrator was convicted of manslaughter and served only three years of a ten-year sentence. Mrs. Johnnie Mae Chappell was more than just a victim of violence; she was a devoted wife to Mr. Willie Chappell Sr., a dedicated mother of ten children, a hardworking domestic/midwife, and a proud resident of Jacksonville's Pickettville neighborhood. This marker honors Mrs. Johnnie Mae Chappell, whose children became wards of the state, forced to grow up in a system without their mother, and whose life was cut short by a racist who, not even knowing her name, aimed his .gun and pulled the trigger. May this marker preserve Mrs. Chappell's legacy, remind us of this tragic incident in Jacksonville's history, and inspire a future dedicated to peace, equality, and justice for all residents of our City". Approved unanimously. The amendments will be rolled together.

Council Member Johnson expressed his gratitude for this historic marker. Council Member Freeman shared his support also.
