AN ORDINANCE REGARDING THE OPIOID AND SUBSTANCE
USE DISORDER SETTLEMENT PROCEEDS GRANT
PROCEDURES; AMENDING SECTION 84.307 (FUNDING
ALLOCATIONS BY OSUD GRANTS COMMITTEE; GRANT
AWARD LIMITATIONS), PART 3 (OPIOID SETTLEMENT
PROCEEDS GRANT AWARDS PROCEDURES), CHAPTER 84
(OPIOID SETTLEMENT PROCEEDS GRANTS), *ORDINANCE
CODE*, TO PROVIDE THAT REQUESTING AGENCIES MAY
SUBMIT MORE THAN ONE GRANT APPLICATION PER
OPIOID SETTLEMENT PROCEEDS FUNDED CATEGORY BUT
SHALL BE ELIGIBLE TO RECEIVE ONLY ONE GRANT PER
FUNDED CATEGORY; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION
INSTRUCTIONS; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Opioid and Substance Use Disorder ("OSUD") Grants
Committee met on March 24, 2025, to discuss changes to Chapter 84,
Ordinance Code, relative to the OSUD Committee's grant award
procedures; a copy of the minutes of said meeting are attached hereto
as **Exhibit 1**; and

WHEREAS, the changes provided herein are intended to encourage
greater participation in the OSUD grant award process, especially by
smaller providers, by limiting the number of grants a particular
applicant may be eligible to receive to one per funded category; now
therefore

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

**Section 1. Amending Section 84.307 (Funding Allocations by
OSUD Grants Committee; Grant Award Limitations), Part 3 (Opioid**

2 **Settlement Proceeds Grants), Ordinance Code.** Section 84.307 (Funding
3 Allocations by OSUD Grants Committee; Grant Award Limitations), Part
4 3 (Opioid Settlement Proceeds Grant Awards Procedures), Chapter 84
5 (Opioid Settlement Proceeds Grants), *Ordinance Code*, is amended to

9 **PART 3. - OPIOID SETTLEMENT PROCEEDS GRANT AWARDS PROCEDURES**

11 **Sec. 84.307. - Funding Allocations by OSUD Grants Committee; Grant**
12 **Award Limitations.**

13 (a) *Limitations on Grant Awards.* Individual grants within each
14 Opioid Settlement Proceeds funded category shall be based on the
15 high score model for funding purposes. The high score model
16 shall award 100 percent of requested funding for the
17 highest-ranked score up to the maximum amount of \$500,000. The
18 next highest-ranked score shall be awarded 100 percent of the
19 requested funding up to \$500,000 and so on until the funds are
20 exhausted. Requesting agencies may submit multiple applications
21 in each Opioid Settlement Proceeds funded category but shall be
22 eligible to receive only one Opioid Settlement Proceeds Grant
23 per funded category. When a requesting agency submits more than
24 one grant application in a funded category, the application
25 receiving the highest average score will be eligible to receive
26 a grant award in accordance with the high score model described
27 herein so long as the application meets the eligibility,
28 application, minimum score and all other applicable requirements
29 for award of an Opioid Settlement Proceeds Grant pursuant to
30 this Part.

1 **Section 2. Codification Instructions.** The Codifier and the
2 Office of General Counsel are authorized to make all chapter and
3 division "tables of contents" consistent with the changes set forth
4 herein. Such editorial changes and any others necessary to make the
5 *Ordinance Code* consistent with the intent of this legislation are
6 approved and directed herein, and changes to the *Ordinance Code* shall
7 be made forthwith and when inconsistencies are discovered.

8 **Section 3. Effective Date.** This Ordinance shall become
9 effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective
10 without the Mayor's signature.
