AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING \$90,000.00 IN GRANT FUNDING FROM END HUMAN TRAFFICKING, INC. D/B/A FLORIDA ALLIANCE TO END HUMAN TRAFFICKING ("GRANTOR"), A NOT-FOR-PROFIT CORPORATION CREATED PURSUANT TO SECTION 16.618, FLORIDA STATUTES, FUNDED THROUGH ITS HUMAN TRAFFICKING GRANT PROGRAM, TOTHE PSBU GRANTS/HUMAN TRAFFICKING GRANT PROGRAM FY24 TO PURCHASE EQUIPMENT AND SOFTWARE TO COMBAT HUMAN TRAFFICKING, AS INITIATED BY B.T. 24-082; APPROVING, AND AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR OR HER DESIGNEE, THE CORPORATION SECRETARY, AND THE SHERIFF TO EXECUTE AND DELIVER ON BEHALF OF THE CITY THE GRANT AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY AND GRANTOR; PROVIDING FOR A CARRYOVER OF FUNDS UNTIL JUNE 30, 2025; PROVIDING FOR OVERSIGHT BY THE JACKSONVILLE SHERIFF'S OFFICE; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Appropriation. For the 2023-2024 fiscal year, within the City's budget, there are hereby appropriated the indicated sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to the account(s) listed in subsection (b):

(c) Explanation of Appropriation:

The funding above represents an appropriation of grant funds from End Human Trafficking, Inc. d/b/a Florida Alliance to End Human Trafficking, a not-for-profit corporation created pursuant to Section 16.618, Florida Statutes ("Grantor"), funded through its Human Trafficking Grant Program to the PSBU Grants/Human Trafficking Grant Program FY24 to purchase equipment and software to combat human trafficking. The grant period commences on the date of execution of the Grant Agreement and continues through June 30, 2025. No local match is required.

Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 1 is to utilize private grant funding from Grantor to deploy new technology and enhance existing technology to be used to investigate human trafficking cases. A copy of the Grant Agreement between the City and Grantor outlining the terms and conditions relative to the grant and use of the grant funds is attached hereto as Exhibit 2 and incorporated herein by this reference (the "Grant Agreement").

Section 3. Approval and Authorization. The Grant Agreement is hereby approved and the Mayor, or her designee, the Corporation Secretary and the Sheriff are hereby authorized to execute and deliver on behalf of the City the Grant Agreement. The foregoing approval and authorization is in addition to, and not a limitation on, all authorizations set forth in Chapter 117 (Grants), Ordinance Code.

Section 4. Carryover The funds appropriated in Section 1 of this Ordinance shall not lapse but shall carryover until June 30, 2025.

Section 5. Oversight. The Jacksonville Sheriff's Office 1 2 shall oversee administration of the grant and project described 3 herein. 4 Section 6. Effective Date.
