#### • Discussion on appraisals for 801 W. Bay St. (Interline Brands property)

Phillip Peterson, Auditor's Office, explained the handout with a charted comparison of the appraisals for downtown properties under consideration.

Council Member Salem expressed interest in proceeding with the purchase based upon the third appraisal.

Bryan Moll, Gateway, indicated that the third appraisal needs to be assessed to reach a mutually agreed upon number.

Council Member Lahnen asked about the total overall City investment in the UF graduate school campus downtown.

Council Member J. Carlucci asked how long it may take to assess the third appraisal, and he noted that with a sale price of \$6.75 million Gateway will have a 68 percent return on investment in a 6 month period.

Cyndy Trimmer said that the purchase of the land and the proposed land swap should each be considered.

Council Member Carlucci said that he is uncomfortable with sidelining DIA from this transaction.

Council Member Howland suggested re-assigning Public Works staff to fill any needed positions.
