ORDINANCE 2021-182-E

AN ORDINANCE REGARDING CHAPTER 118 (CITY GRANTS), ORDINANCE CODE; ESTABLISHING THE 2021-2022 CATEGORIES OF MOST VULNERABLE PERSONS AND NEEDS FOR PUBLIC SERVICE GRANT APPROPRIATIONS; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Public Service Grant Council met on February 22, 2021 to approve the Fiscal Year 2021-2022 Most Vulnerable Persons and Needs, a copy of the minutes of said meeting are attached hereto as Revised Exhibit 1, labeled as "Revised Exhibit 1, Rev Minutes, April 19, 2021 - NCSPHS"; and

WHEREAS, the City Council through this ordinance is hereby establishing the Most Vulnerable Persons and Needs for the 2021-2022 Fiscal Year; now therefore

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Categories of Most Vulnerable Persons and Needs Established. Pursuant to Section 118.804, (Categories of Most Vulnerable Persons and Needs), Ordinance Code, the following categories of Most Vulnerable Persons and Needs, as recommended by the Public Service Grant Council in the letter attached hereto as Exhibit 2, are hereby established for the 2021-2022 Fiscal Year:

2021-2022 Categories of Most Vulnerable Persons and Needs

1. Acute. The percentage of available funding allocated to this category shall be 35%.

- 2. Prevention. The percentage of available funding allocated to this category shall be 40%.
- 3. Self-Sufficiency. The percentage of available funding allocated to this category shall be 25%.

Detailed definitions of each of the categories of Most Vulnerable Persons and Needs are set forth in **Exhibit 3**.

Most Vulnerable Persons and Needs. Public Service Grants made by City Council shall be used to exclusively serve the categories of Most Vulnerable Persons and Needs. Where a category contains more funding than applied for, then the excess funding for that population may be applied to a category that contains less funding than applied for. Where more than one category has fewer funds than applied for, then the excess funding shall be divided among the underfunded categories on a percentage basis where the total amount underfunded in all underfunded categories is the denominator and the amount underfunded in any one category is the numerator.

Section 3. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
