Section 1. Appropriation. For the 2023-2024 fiscal year,
within the City's budget, there is hereby appropriated the indicated

Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 1 is to increase the City's Emergency Reserve by an additional \$20,000,000 to bring the total Emergency Reserve funds to an amount equal to 7 percent (7%) of the City's total General Fund/General Services District operating budget in order to meet the new financial planning target range for the Emergency Reserve as set forth below.

21 Section 3. Amending Sections 106.106 (Balanced Budget and 22 Budget Stabilization Reserve), and 106.107 (Emergency Reserve Policy 23 and Fund), Part 1 (General Provisions), Chapter 106 (Budget and Accounting Code), Ordinance Code. Sections 106.106 (Balanced Budget 24 25 and Budget Stabilization Reserve), and 106.107 (Emergency Reserve 26 Policy and Fund), Part 1 (General Provisions), Chapter 106 (Budget 27 and Accounting Code), Ordinance Code, are hereby amended to read as 2.8 follows:

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CHAPTER 106 - BUDGET AND ACCOUNTING CODE

PART 1. - GENERAL PROVISIONS

Sec. 106.106. - Balanced Budget and Budget Stabilization Reserve.

* * *

(b) The following financial planning targets (identified as percentages of the operating budget) are established to assist the City in returning to traditional cash based funding by fiscal year 2012-2013:

(i) General Fund.

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Operating Reserve	5-7%
Emergency Reserve	<u>7-10%</u> 5-7%
Budgeted Contingency	1%
Pay-as-you-go Capital	The value of 1 mill of property taxes

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10 Sec. 106.107. - Emergency Reserve Policy and Fund.

11 There is hereby established a separate fund (Emergency Reserve) in the City which shall be established as part of the budget beginning 12 13 with the 2005-2006 budget and which shall annually contain the emergency reserve for the City. The initial goal for the Emergency 14 15 Reserve shall be up to \$40,000,000. The Emergency Reserve shall not be used except as initiated by the Mayor through written communication 16 to City Council, explaining the emergency, and subsequent approval 17 by two-thirds vote of all City Council members. 18

The Emergency Reserve can be used to address unanticipated non-19 reimbursed expenditures arising out of a hurricane, tornado, other 20 major weather related events, and/or other massive infrastructure 21 22 failures or other disasters, whether man made or caused by nature. 23 Under normal circumstances, the City would first elect to utilize the Operating Reserve before considering use of its Emergency Reserve. 24 25 In the event the City is entitled to reimbursement of Emergency Reserve expenditures, the City shall take all such actions necessary 26

1 to secure such reimbursements, and all such reimbursements are hereby 2 appropriated to the Emergency Reserve.

All interest earned in Emergency Reserve in Fiscal Year 2008-3 2009 and after shall accrue and remain within the Emergency Reserve. 4 5 The balance in the Emergency Reserve shall be reported to the City Council Finance Committee at least quarterly. The goal for the City 6 7 Emergency Reserve Fund is to equal approximately seven to ten percent (25.5 days average cash flow) of the total General Fund/General 8 9 Services District budgeted expenditures. Annually, during the budget 10 process, the Mayor, if the minimum goals are not met shall recommend added contributions to the Emergency Reserve. 11

12 Section 4. Codification Instructions. The Codifier and the 13 Office of General Counsel are authorized to make all chapter and 14 division "table of contents" consistent with the changes set forth 15 herein. Such editorial changes and any other necessary to make the 16 Ordinance Code consistent with the intent of this legislation are 17 approved and directed herein, and the changes to the Ordinance Code 18 shall be made forthwith and when inconsistencies are discovered.

19 Section 5. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become 20 effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective 21 without the Mayor's signature.
