AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING AN \$83,000.00 GRANT FROM THE UNITED STATES ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY, FUNDED THROUGH THE INFLATION REDUCTION ACT OF 2022, TO PROCURE EQUIPMENT FOR AIR QUALITY MONITORING FOR PARTICULATE MATTER IN AND NEAR LOW INCOME AND DISADVANTAGED COMMUNITIES, AS INITIATED BY B.T. 25-066; PROVIDING FOR CARRYOVER OF FUNDS INTO FISCAL YEAR 2028-2029; PROVIDING FOR OVERSIGHT BY THE OFFICE OF ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES DEPARTMENT, ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY DIVISION; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

(c) Explanation of Appropriation

The appropriation above is a grant award from the United States Environmental Protection Agency funded by the

Inflation Reduction Act of 2022. The grant funds will be used to procure equipment for continuous monitoring for particulate matter concentrations in low income and disadvantaged communities. The grant period commenced on October 1, 2024 and ends December 31, 2027. No local match is required.

Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 1 is to procure new air quality monitoring devices to monitor particulate matter in and near low income and disadvantaged communities who face disproportionate exposure to air pollutants resulting in an increased vulnerability for health risks. The new PM2.5, NO2 and black carbon air sensors will provide 24-hour, seven days per week, real-time reporting of air quality concentrations which will be provided to the community through a public website. A copy of the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency Grant Agreement is attached hereto as Exhibit 2.

Section 3. Carryover. The funds appropriated in this Ordinance shall not lapse but shall carryover to fiscal year 2028-2029.

Services Department, Environmental Quality Division, shall oversee the grant and project described herein, including preparation and submittal of any reports required by the grant.

Section 5. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
