AN ORDINANCE APPROVING THE PROPOSED OCTOBER 1, 2021 - SEPTEMBER 30, 2024 COLLECTIVE BARGAINING AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF JACKSONVILLE AND THE AMERICAN FEDERATION OF STATE, COUNTY AND MUNICIPAL EMPLOYEES (AFSCME) REPRESENTING APPROXIMATELY 1,900 MEMBERS, INCLUDING PARTTIME EMPLOYEES; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Proposed Collective Bargaining Agreement between the City of Jacksonville and AFSCME approved. That certain proposed October 1, 2021 - September 30, 2024 Collective Bargaining Agreement between the City of Jacksonville and the American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees (AFSCME), a copy of which has been placed On File with the Office of Legislative Services, is hereby approved. AFSCME represents approximately 1,900 members, including part-time employees. The proposed AFSCME agreement has been agreed to in collective bargaining and has been ratified by the union membership. Pursuant to the American Rescue Plan, from which funds are being used for premium pay associated with the Collectively Bargaining Agreements, the City has made a general determination that premium pay will not increase the average annual wage at the City 150 percent of the state or county's average annual above wage. Further, the City considers all government employees at the City to be performing critical and essential functions necessary to meet the needs of the Citizens of Jacksonville. One time premium payments and wage increases collectively bargained recognize the

extraordinary efforts the men and women of the City performed and 1 continue to perform during the COVID-19 pandemic. 2 Section 2. **Effective Date.** This ordinance and all elements 3 of the AFSCME Collective Bargaining Agreement shall become effective 4 upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the 5 Mayor's signature. 6 8 Form Approved: 9 10 11 /s/ Margaret M.
