AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING A NEIGHBORHOOD ASSESSMENT PROGRAM (NAP) FOR THERICHMOND SHADOWLAWN NEIGHBORHOOD FOR UNDERGROUND POWER AND COMMUNICATIONS IMPROVEMENTS, PURSUANT TO CHAPTER 714 (NEIGHBORHOOD ASSESSMENT PROGRAMS), (UNDERGROUND POWER AND COMMUNICATIONS PROGRAM AREA), ORDINANCE CODE; IDENTIFYING JEA FOR NAP PROJECT PERFORMANCE; EXPRESSING INTENT TO USE THE UNIFORM METHOD FOR NON-AD VALOREM ASSESSMENTS, PURSUANT TO SECTION 197.3632(3)(a), FLORIDA STATUTES; DIRECTING DISTRIBUTION OF THIS ORDINANCE BY LEGISLATIVE SERVICES; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

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WHEREAS, property owners within the Richmond Street & Shadowlawn Street neighborhood filed a Petition for a Neighborhood Assessment Program (NAP) for Underground Power and Communications Improvements, pursuant to Chapter 714 (Neighborhood Assessment Programs), Part 3 (Underground Power and Communications Program Area), Ordinance Code, and such Petition is attached hereto as Revised Exhibit 1 labeled as "Revised Exhibit 1, Rev Petition, September 20, 2021 - NCSPHS"; and WHEREAS, the Petition is signed by at least 43 of the 61 property owners, or 70.5 percent of the 66.67 percent required within the area benefited by the Underground Power and Communications Improvements; and

WHEREAS, all other requirements of Chapter 714 (Neighborhood Assessment Programs), Part 3 (Underground Power and Communications Program Area), Ordinance Code, have been met; now, therefore

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Establishing the Richmond/Shadowlawn NAP. Pursuant to Chapter 714 (Neighborhood Assessment Programs), Part 3 (Underground Power and Communications Program Area), Ordinance Code, the City Council hereby establishes the Richmond/Shadowlawn NAP, as defined in the Petition, attached hereto as Revised Exhibit 1 labeled as "Revised Exhibit 1, Rev Petition, September 20, 2021 - NCSPHS". The estimated total Underground Power and Communication Improvements cost is \$971,334.00. The estimated annual non-ad valorem assessment, per parcel, is \$1,195.00, for twenty (20) years.

Pursuant to Section 714.304(f), Ordinance Code, JEA shall be the government entity providing NAP financing and project performance and shall undertake the completion of all work associated with the planning, project management, financing, supply of material and labor, and overall construction of the Underground Power and Communication Improvements, including coordination with other utilities. Pursuant to Section 714.305, Ordinance Code, construction and all other project costs shall be initially funded by JEA, and all costs incurred in support of the Underground Power and Communication Improvements shall be reimbursed to JEA through this NAP.

Section 3. Expressing Intent to Use the Uniform Method for the Levy, Collection, and Enforcement of Non-Ad Valorem Assessments. Pursuant to Section 197.3632(3)(a), Florida Statutes, the City Council hereby expresses its intent to use the uniform method for the levy, collection, and enforcement of non-ad valorem assessments pursuant to the Richmond/Shadowlawn NAP. This levy is necessary to reimburse JEA for the initial funding of the Underground Power and

Communication Improvements, as described in the Petition attached hereto as Revised Exhibit 1 labeled as "Revised Exhibit 1, Rev Petition, September 20, 2021 - NCSPHS". The legal description of the boundaries of the real property subject to the levy is included in the Petition. Pursuant to Section 197.3632(4), Florida Statutes, the City Council shall adopt the non-ad valorem assessment roll at a public hearing prior to September 15, 2022. This Ordinance shall serve as the Resolution required by Section 197.3632(3)(a), Florida Statutes.

Section 4. Distribution by Legislative Services. Pursuant to Section 197.3632(3)(a), Florida Statutes, Legislative Services is hereby directed to mail a copy of this Ordinance, as enacted, to the Property Appraiser, the Tax Collector, and the State of Florida Department of Revenue, Property Tax Oversight Division.

Section 5. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
