ORDINANCE 2025-391

AN ORDINANCE PERTAINING TO CAPITAL PROJECTS; PROVIDING THAT PROJECT BALANCES FROM CERTAIN CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS IDENTIFIED HEREIN BE CLOSED TO AN ACTIVITY ENTITLED "COUNCIL CONTINGENCY – DOGE" AND PROHIBITING THE TRANSFER OF FUNDS FROM SAID CAPITAL PROJECTS EXCEPT TO THE COUNCIL CONTINGENCY – DOGE ACTIVITY UPON PROJECT COMPLETION; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

Summary of the proposed ordinance (must include a statement of the public purpose, such as serving the public health, safety, morals, and welfare): This legislation requires any unexpended funds remaining in an enumerated list of Capital Improvement Plan projects be transferred upon project completion to an activity/account entitled "Council Contingency DOGE" or to the Council Discretionary Project of origin or the Special Council Reserve, as applicable, for future appropriation by City Council. It also prohibits the transfer of any residual funds from these projects except to the Council Contingency DOGE, the Discretionary Council Projects, or the Special Council Reserve, as applicable. This serves the public interest by ensuring these funds are set aside until the Council can conduct a review of the FY 25-26 budget for the consolidated government to determine how these funds are best allocated looking at the overall finances and budgetary position of the City as a whole, rather than by appropriating these funds in a more piecemeal fashion.
