Funding of the forgivable loans will require future appropriation by the Jacksonville City Council and will be sought after the time to completion can be reasonably determined. Construction is expected to be completed by 3Q2026. The grants (forgivable loans) will be funded from the General Fund pursuant to the Downtown Preservation and Revitalization Program and through the Downtown Economic Development Fund in an amount up to \$2,560,000 for the redevelopment of the building located at 225 N Laura Street.

This project would not be feasible without support from the City through the DPRP, or alternative capital subsidy. The building requires significant rehabilitation to ensure ADA compliance and environmental abatement of hazardous materials to make it ready to be used once again and contribute to the City's tax base in its highest and best use.
