EMERGENCY/AMEND/APPROVE

There was some discussion about this bill, which bill encourages the JEA Board to take formal action at the next JEA Board meeting to rescind the Invitation to Negotiate, adopted by the JEA board at the July 23, 2019 Board meeting. While the resolution is not an enforceable document, it shows the stance of the City Council on this issue and will show in the future that this current Council did weigh in on JEA recapitalization and the circumstances surrounding the process. The JEA Board voted stop to negotiations last month, but City Council should be a part of any discussions for any potential future transactions. It was mentioned that the City Charter should be examined to assess the permissibility of independent agencies deciding to sell themselves without council consent. public support or timely notice to the Council Auditors as required by the JEA Charter. CM Morgan noted that the City Charter is a living document, which should be evaluated as needed to change with modernity and events. The TEU Committee approved an amendment to add a section to the bill directing JEA Board to bring any future discussions regarding a recapitalization event or actions contemplated under 21.04(p) of the Charter to City Council and obtain approval before moving forward with such actions. The Rules Committee approved the TEU amendment and voted unanimously in support of the resolution. The series of fact finding workshops on the Future of JEA, led by CM Boylan, will continue in order to be fully apprised of the the structure of the eighth largest municipally owned utility as well as to ensure that the rate payers are informed as to the potential future of JEA.

CM Priestly Jackson spoke about the use of 'point of order' during meeting debates. According to parliamentary procedures, any member who notices a breach of the rules has a right to call immediate attention to the fact and insist that the rules be enforced by raising a point of order. Points of order may interrupt the speaker, do not require seconds, are not debatable or amendable, and the decisions are at the discretion of the chair. It was stated that the use of point of order should be based only upon procedural issues, and not used politically or when a member disagrees with the position of the speaker. The Rules Chair will bring this issue up for discussion at the next full council agenda meeting.

There was also a brief discussion about the vetting of board/commission appointees, who are approved by the Rules Committee before they may serve. CM DeFoor asked about conflict of interest disclosures, which are covered in the required ethics training for all board appointees. CM Carlucci said that the onus for conflict disclosure should be on the appointee. It was mentioned that there should be comprehensive questions asked of each appointee during their one on one meetings prior to their appearances before the Rules committee. The members agreed that they do not all have to use a uniform list of questions, but that they need to make all efforts to make sure appointees understand the role of whichever board/commission they are being appointed to, and that council members know as much as possible about candidates prior to committee approval.
