RESOLUTION 2022-426-A

A RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING AND COMMENDING JACKSONVILLE AREA SEXUAL MINORITY YOUTH NETWORK (JASMYN) ON ITS PROVISION OF NEEDED SERVICES TO AND ADVOCACY ON BEHALF OF YOUTH IN NORTHEAST FLORIDA DURING THE MONTH OF JUNE, WHICH IS LGTBQ PRIDE MONTH; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, JASMYN was founded in Jacksonville in 1994 and has positively impacted the lives of thousands of young people for 28 years; and

WHEREAS, JASMYN supports the empowerment of LGBTQIA+ young people through leadership, advocacy, resources, and a safe and affirming community. JASMYN is expanding its campus in downtown Jacksonville so it will have greater capacity through this Safe Place to assure that LGBTQIA+ young people's identities, aspirations and contributions are valued and affirmed; and

WHEREAS, JASMYN provides access to critical health services in partnership with other community organizations. Duval County has a significant youth population living with HIV, and JASMYN has provided thousands of HIV tests to youth for over 2 decades and supported hundreds of newly and previously diagnosed youth to get linked to medical care; and

WHEREAS, over 40% of the youth who are homeless in Jacksonville identify as LGBTQ, and JASMYN assists LGBTQIA+ young people to find safe, stable housing through its housing support programs. JASMYN additionally provides the LGBTQIA+ youth community with access to

food and hygiene pantry services, laundry facilities, and showers; and

WHEREAS, LGBTQIA+ youth disproportionately report being bullied, threatened, and feeling depressed, so JASMYN provides mental health counseling services to support LGBTQIA+ young people and directly supports Duval County students to assist them in making their school environments safer and more inclusive; and

WHEREAS, JASMYN plays an important role in advocating for best practices and policies that support LGBTQIA+ youth in schools, services, and in the Jacksonville community. As a lead partner in the Jacksonville Coalition for Equality, JASMYN successfully advocated for the City of Jacksonville to update its Human Rights Ordinance to protect the LGBTQIA+ community from discrimination and hosts annual events like Strides for Pride and the Coming Out Day Breakfast to bring hundreds of people together annually to celebrate the LGBTQIA+ community and community and business allies who work together to improve the lives of LGBTQIA+ people in Jacksonville; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. The City Council hereby recognizes and commends Jacksonville Area Sexual Youth Minority Network (JASMYN) on its provision of needed services to and advocacy for sexual minority youth in Jacksonville and Northeast Florida during the month of June, which is LGTBQ Pride Month across America. JASMYN provides invaluable services to a vulnerable population and advocates for fairness and equality for all people which improves our community.

Section 2. Effective Date. This Resolution shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
