AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO APPLY TO FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION ("FDEP") FOR GRANT FUNDING THROUGH THE READINESS AND RECREATION INITIATIVE GRANT PROGRAM FUNDED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF THE INTERIOR, NATIONAL PARK SERVICE, AND THE DEPARTMENT OF DEFENSE, AND COMMITTING TO UNDERTAKE A FUTURE PROJECT TO ACQUIRE DEVELOP APPROXIMATELY 57± ACRES OF PROPERTY (R.E. NUMBER 168281-0000 AND R.E. 168437-0000) LOCATED ADJACENT TO NAVAL STATION MAYPORT ALONG STATE ROUTE A1A ("PROJECT") SUBJECT TO THE GRANT AWARD; AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR, OR HER DESIGNEE, AND THE CORPORATION SECRETARY TO EXECUTE AND DELIVER ALL GRANT AGREEMENTS BETWEEN THE CITY AND FDEP, AS WELL AS DOCUMENTS RELATED TO SUCH ALL GRANTS; ACKNOWLEDGING WILLINGNESS TO AMEND THE CITY'S CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PLAN TO INCLUDE THE PROJECT; PROVIDING FOR CITY OVERSIGHT BY THE DEPARTMENT OF PARKS, RECREATION AND COMMUNITY SERVICES; REQUESTING ONE CYCLE EMERGENCY PASSAGE; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS,

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Assistance and Readiness and Environmental Protection Integration (REPI) Partnership Challenge Program, known as the Readiness and Recreation Initiative Grant Program (the "Program"), is a federal grant opportunity funded by the Department of the Interior, National Park Service, and the Department of Defense, providing for the acquisition or acquisition and development of compatible recreation facilities on public lands within a REPI Partnership Agreement or Sentinel Landscape boundary; and WHEREAS, the City of Jacksonville ("City") in partnership with

the Land and Water Conservation Fund (LWCF) State

the United States Navy ("Navy") has identified an approximately 57±-acre parcel of land, containing frontage on the Intracoastal Waterway, (the "Property") that is owned by a willing seller, and qualifies for the Program, which Property is shown in context to the neighboring city, state and federal lands on Exhibit 1 attached hereto and incorporated by reference herein; and

WHEREAS, the Navy is interested in holding a restrictive easement over the Property and contributing federal funds to the City's acquisition of the Property to increase outdoor recreation opportunities for nearby Navy family housing and the general public, promote compatible land use by preserving the Navy's operational mission, and enhance the resilience of Naval Station Mayport; and

WHEREAS, Program grant applications may be accompanied by legislation committing the applicant to amend its Capital Improvement Plan and complete the proposed project should it receive the grant; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Parks, Recreation and Community Services has recommended the Project for submission to FDEP; now therefore

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville: Recitals. The recitals above are true Section 1.

correct and incorporated herein by reference.

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Section 2. Approved Project. The Shermans Creek Acquisition project ("Project") as more fully described in the Project Information Sheet attached hereto as Revised Exhibit 2, labeled as "Revised Exhibit 2, Rev PI Sheet, April 1, 2024 - NCSPHS" and incorporated herein by this reference, has been recommended by the Department of Parks, Recreation and Community Services and is approved for submission to the FDEP for purposes of applying for and receiving grants from the Program. The Project is anticipated to occur in FY 2024-2025 and cost \$1,875,000, which includes a 50% acquisition cost of \$625,000 funded through the Program grant and an additional \$1,250,000 funded by the City for passive recreational improvements. In addition to the foregoing, it is expected that the Navy will contribute additional funds at the closing of the acquisition of the Property.

**Section 3. Authorization.** The Mayor, for and on behalf of the City, is hereby authorized to apply for the Program grant for funding of the Project.

Section 4. Execution Authorized. The Mayor, or her designee, and the Corporation Secretary are hereby authorized to execute and deliver, for and on behalf of the City, all grant agreements, including any grant agreement extensions, for the Project between the City and FDEP, as well as any and all documents related to such grants.

Section 5. Acknowledging Willingness to Amend Capital Improvement Plan. The City of Jacksonville is willing to amend its Five-Year Capital Improvement Plan to include the Project described in Revised Exhibit 2 and complete such Project if it receives grant funding from the Program.

Section 6. Oversight Department. The Department of Parks, Recreation and Community Services shall oversee the Project.
