ΒE KNOWN AS THE "JOSEPH A. CARLUCCI

BUILDING"; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City of Jacksonville owns the building located at 711 North Liberty Street, Jacksonville, Florida 32202, in Council District 7; and

WHEREAS, said building opened in September 1926 and served as the Jacksonville Police Headquarters until the mid-1970s when the Police Department, now known post-consolidation as the "Office of the Sheriff - Jacksonville Police", relocated to the new Police Memorial Building on East Bay Street; in 1984-85 the building was gutted and renovated to become the Florida Department of Law Enforcement (FDLE) Northeast Regional Headquarters; and

WHEREAS, the building continued to be occupied by FDLE for a number of years until it was vacated and remained so until the Jacksonville Sheriff's Office (JSO) re-occupied the building where it has since housed various JSO functions and departments; and

WHEREAS, in 1986 while still occupying the building, FDLE dedicated and named the building the "Joseph A. Carlucci Building"; however, since that time the signage and plaque recognizing this name have been removed, and the building no longer holds the distinction of the Joseph A. Carlucci name; and

WHEREAS, Joseph A. Carlucci is recognized for his long and successful career, as both a member of the Jacksonville City Council and the Florida Senate, and for his unwavering dedication to the clients he served working with the State Farm Insurance Company; and

WHEREAS, in 1968, Mr. Carlucci was elected to the Jacksonville City Council to represent At-Large, Group 3, a seat to which he was subsequently re-elected in 1971 and 1975; in 1978, Mr. Carlucci was elected to the Florida Senate, District 8, seat and remained in that office until his death in 1986; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Carlucci was the recipient of numerous awards during his political career, chief among them being the Distinguished Councilman of the Year Award he received in both 1968-69 and 1971-72; he was also honored by various community service groups for his dedication to a myriad of causes important to Jacksonville; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Carlucci's long and distinguished career was marked by a number of significant state and local initiatives credited to his forward-thinking views including establishment of the Consumer Affairs Division for the City of Jacksonville and development of successful legislation regulating the City's hiring of professional services which later became the model for similar legislation for the state of Florida; and

WHEREAS, during his tenure on the Florida Senate, Mr. Carlucci undertook a number of initiatives to reform the Florida criminal justice system and child abuse laws; he also served on the Joint Legislative Auditing Committee and became known as "the taxpayer's watchdog" over questionable state expenditures; and

WHEREAS, the Jacksonville City Council desires to recognize Joseph A. Carlucci for his many contributions to the state of Florida and the city of Jacksonville by (re)naming the building located at 711 North Liberty Street the "Joseph A. Carlucci Building" pursuant

to Section 122.105, Ordinance Code; now, therefore

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. The building located at 711 North Liberty Street, Jacksonville, Florida 32202, is hereby named the "Joseph A. Carlucci Building" in accordance with the procedures set forth in Section 122.105, Ordinance Code. The Jacksonville Sheriff's Office is the sole occupant of this building and will continue to be responsible for its maintenance and upkeep.

Section 2. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
