AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING THE CITY OF JACKSONVILLE EMERGENCY RESERVE; APPROPRIATING \$20,000,000 FROM THE CITY'S GENERAL FUND/GENERAL SERVICES DISTRICT OPERATING RESERVE TO THE EMERGENCY RESERVE TO INCREASE THE TOTAL EMERGENCY RESERVE BALANCE TO 7 PERCENT OF THE CITY'S GENERAL FUND/GENERAL SERVICES DISTRICT OPERATING BUDGET TO MEET THE NEW FINANCIAL PLANNING TARGET OF 7 TO 10 PERCENT (7-10%) FOR THE EMERGENCY RESERVE PROVIDED FOR HEREIN; AMENDING SECTIONS 106.106 (BALANCED BUDGET AND BUDGET STABILIZATION RESERVE), AND 106.107 (EMERGENCY RESERVE POLICY AND FUND), PART 1 (GENERAL PROVISIONS), CHAPTER 106 (BUDGET AND ACCOUNTING CODE), ORDINANCE CODE, TO INCREASE THE FINANCIAL PLANNING TARGET FOR THE CITY'S EMERGENCY RESERVE TO 7 TO 10 PERCENT (7-10%); PROVIDING CODIFICATION INSTRUCTIONS; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Appropriation. For the 2023-2024 fiscal year, within the City's budget, there is hereby appropriated the indicated sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to the account(s) listed in subsection (b):

percentages of the operating budget) are established to assist the City in returning to cash based funding by fiscal year 2012-2013:

(i) General Fund.

Sec. 106.107. - Emergency Reserve Policy and Fund.

There is hereby established a separate fund (Emergency Reserve) in the City which shall be established as part of the budget beginning with the 2005-2006 budget and which shall annually contain the emergency reserve for the City. The initial goal for the Emergency Reserve shall be up to \$40,000,000. The Emergency Reserve shall not be used except as initiated by the Mayor through written communication to City Council, explaining the emergency, and subsequent approval by two-thirds vote of all City Council members.

The Emergency Reserve can be used to address unanticipated non-reimbursed expenditures arising out of a hurricane, tornado, other major weather related events, and/or other massive infrastructure failures or other disasters, whether man made or caused by nature. Under normal circumstances, the City would first elect to utilize the Operating Reserve before considering use of its Emergency Reserve. In the event the City is entitled to reimbursement of Emergency Reserve expenditures, the City shall take all such actions necessary to secure such reimbursements, and all such reimbursements are hereby appropriated to the Emergency Reserve.

All interest earned in Emergency Reserve—in Fiscal Year 2008-2009 and after—shall accrue and remain within the Emergency Reserve.

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The balance in the Emergency Reserve shall be reported to the City Council Finance Committee at least quarterly. The goal for the City Emergency Reserve Fund is to equal approximately seven to ten percent (25.5 days average cash flow) of the total General Fund/General Services District budgeted expenditures. Annually, during the budget process, the Mayor, if the minimum goals are not met shall recommend added contributions to the Emergency Reserve.

Section 4. Codification Instructions. The Codifier and the Office of General Counsel are authorized to make all chapter and division "table of contents" consistent with the changes set forth herein. Such editorial changes and any other necessary to make the Ordinance Code consistent with the intent of this legislation are approved and directed herein, and the changes to the Ordinance Code shall be made forthwith and when inconsistencies are discovered.

Section 5. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
