### REPORT OF THE PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT

The Planning and Development Department hereby forwards to the Planning Commission; Land Use and Zoning Committee, and City Council its comments and recommendations on:

#### **ORDINANCE 2020-409**

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 656 (ZONING CODE), PART 12 (LANDSCAPE AND TREE PROTECTION REGULATIONS), SUBPART B (TREE PROTECTION), SECTION 656.1205 (REMOVAL OF PROTECTED TREES PROHIBITED; EXCEPTIONS), ORDINANCE CODE, TO CREATE A NEW EXEMPTION FOR CITY MAINTAINED CEMETERIES AND REMEDIATION SITES IN CERTAIN CIRCUMSTANCES; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

### I. GENERAL INFORMATION

The bill adds language requiring the cleanup of contaminated soils, sediments, surface waters, and groundwater, including hazardous waste and solid waste debris materials and air discharges and cemeteries where trees interfere with burial plots and associated structures. The primary methodology used for the City of Jacksonville-owned sites is to remove the upper 2.0-feet of soils, place a clean soil cap, establish a vegetative cover, and place engineering and covenant restrictions on the parcel to eliminate threats to human health and the environment. Clearing and grubbing to remove the underbrush, timber, and root mat/balls are essential to placing the soil cap. Contaminated sites subject to the tree ordinance requirements severely affect the cost of remediation that limits the Solid Waste Division from getting regulatory closure of these sites in a timely manner. The remediation of contamination where the City of Jacksonville has been determined to be the Responsible Party for cleanup also includes cemeteries requiring maintenance, repair, and/or rehabilitation where the cemetery has no "perpetual care" entity.

## II. EVALUATION

### A. The need and justification for the change

Contaminated sites subject to the tree ordinance requirements severely affect the cost of remediation that limits the Solid Waste Division from getting regulatory closure of these sites in a timely manner. The remediation of contamination where the City of Jacksonville has been determined to be the Responsible Party for cleanup also includes cemeteries requiring maintenance, repair, and/or rehabilitation where the cemetery has no "perpetual care" entity.

# B. Consistency with the Comprehensive Plan.

This bill is consistent with numerous goals, policies, and objectives of the Comprehensive Plan, including but not limited to:

# **Future Land Use Element (FLUE) Policy 1.1.8**

Ensure that all future development and redevelopment meets or exceeds the requirements of all Land Development Regulations, including, but not limited to zoning, subdivision of land, land-scape and tree protection regulations, and signage, as established and adopted by the City, State of Florida and the federal government, unless such requirements have been previously waived by those governmental bodies.

# **FLUE Policy 4.1.5**

Continue enforcement of existing Land Development Regulations in the City, which are consistent with this plan, including:

- Zoning Code
- Code of Subdivision Regulations
- Flood Plain Regulations
- Landscape and Tree Protection Regulations
- Housing Safety Code
- Unsafe Buildings and Structures Code
- Community Redevelopment Programs
- Building Code

# III. RECOMMENDATION

The Planning and Development Department recommends that Ordinance 2020-409 be APPROVED.

ORDINANCE 2020-409

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 656 (ZONING CODE), PART 12 (LANDSCAPE AND TREE PROTECTION REGULATIONS), SUBPART В (TREE PROTECTION), SECTION 656.1205 (REMOVAL OF PROTECTED TREES PROHIBITED; EXCEPTIONS), ORDINANCE CODE, A NEW EXEMPTION FOR CITY MAINTAINED CEMETERIES AND REMEDIATION SITES IN CERTAIN CIRCUMSTANCES; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Amending Chapter 656 (Zoning Code), Part 12 Section 1. (Landscape and Tree Protection Regulations), Subpart B Protection), Ordinance Code. Chapter 656 (Zoning Code), Part 12 (Landscape and Tree Protection Regulations), Subpart B (Tree Protection), Ordinance Code, is hereby amended to read as follows:

#### CHAPTER 656 - ZONING CODE

#### PART 12. - LANDSCAPE AND TREE PROTECTION REGULATIONS

## SUBPART B. - TREE PROTECTION

Sec. 656.1205. - Removal of protected trees prohibited; exceptions.

(a) No person, organization, society, association corporation, or any agent or representative thereof, directly or indirectly, shall cut down, remove, damage or destroy, or shall authorize the cutting down, removal, damage, or destruction of any protected tree, as defined in Section 656.1203(bb) hereof, or shall commit any act or authorize the commission of any act which physically removes a protected tree or causes a tree to die, such as damage inflicted upon the root system by heavy machinery, chemicals or paving, changing the natural grade above the root system and tree damage permitting infection or pest infestation, without first having obtained a permit as herein provided.

(b) The following protected trees are exempted from the provisions of subsection (a). Where an exemption is claimed, an applicant must obtain a permit pursuant to Section 656.1206 for a fee as found in <a href="www.coj.net/fees">www.coj.net/fees</a>, and provide supporting evidence that the applicant is entitled to the exemption, as requested by the Building Inspection Division:

\* \* \*

# (9) <u>Trees in cemeteries meeting one of the following</u> criteria:

Α. Any tree located on an individual cemetery plot and removed at the request and with the consent of individual cemetery plot owner; provided, however, that this exemption shall not apply to the expansion of existing cemeteries. As used in this subsection, cemetery plot shall mean a lot in any cemetery designated and maintained for the interment of a human body, or bodies or remains thereof and for no other purpose. As used in this subsection, cemetery plot owner shall mean a person, or his representative, in whose name a plot is listed in a cemetery organization's office as the owner of the exclusive right of sepulture or burial right; holds or who from a organization, a certificate of ownership or other instrument of conveyance of the exclusive right of sepulture or burial right in a particular plot in the organization's cemetery. If the cemetery plot owner or any living relative of the deceased cannot be located

after a good faith effort by the City to search for the owner, the City may remove the tree if it is damaging headstones or other structures associated with the plot; or

B. Any tree located in a cemetery that is being maintained by the City of Jacksonville pursuant to Sec. 497.284, Florida Statutes (Abandoned cemeteries; immunity; actions) that:

(i) is not located on an individual cemetery plot within such cemetery; and

(ii) is interfering with structures such as a road, fence, monuments, mausoleum, columbarium, ossuary, or other structure or place used or intended to be used for the interment or disposition of cremated remains.

\* \* \*

(12) Trees located within the areal extent of contamination or in very close proximity to the contamination and removal is necessary for implementation of a remediation plan required to assess or remove contaminants in soil, surface water or groundwater, pursuant to a governmental Consent Order or Decree or other remedial action plan required by a regulatory agency.

\* \* \*

Section 2. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
