AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING A CONTINUATION GRANT; PROVIDING FOR PARTICIPATION IN THE COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT (CDBG) PROGRAM; APPROPRIATING \$6,571,550.00 FOR PROGRAM COSTS, AS INITIATED BY B.T. 21-001; PROVIDING FOR THE AWARD, AUTHORIZATION, AND FUNDING, AND FOR THE CITY OF JACKSONVILLE TO EXECUTE FEDERAL PROGRAM CONTRACTS FOR CDBG PROGRAM FUNDS, AS APPLICABLE, TO IMPLEMENT B.T. 21-001; PROVIDING FOR PURPOSE; PROVIDING FOR FURTHER COUNCIL ACTION IF REVENUE DIFFERS; PROVIDING FOR THE MAYOR AND CORPORATION SECRETARY TO EXECUTE AND DELIVER DOCUMENTS RELATING TO THE AWARDS; APPROVING POSITIONS, AS INITIATED BY R.C. 21-001; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development awards to local governments annual Community Development Block Grant ("CDBG") Program funds on a formula basis, and the local government may further award the CDBG funds to recipient organizations to implement the CDBG program; and

WHEREAS, the CDBG program works to provide activities that develop viable urban communities by: providing decent affordable housing and a suitable living environment; providing services to the most vulnerable in our communities; creating jobs through the expansion and retention of businesses; and, expanding economic opportunities, principally for low and moderate income persons; and

WHEREAS, the City of Jacksonville is expected to receive \$6,571,550.00 in CDBG funds from the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development on or about October 1, 2021, and these moneys require appropriation; and

WHEREAS, the Jacksonville Housing and Community Development Commission (the "Commission") has been designated as the agency to provide oversight and guidance to the City of Jacksonville's Neighborhoods Department, Housing and Community Development Division, and the Commission shall make recommendations on all agreements for community development and affordable housing and related programs entered into for and on behalf of the City as set forth in Section 34.203, Ordinance Code; and

WHEREAS, the Commission has engaged in its 2020-2021 Universal Cycle application process and awarded contract(s) to housing providers and for community development pending receipt and appropriation of the 2020-2021 CDBG funds from the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development for the appropriations and authorizations relating to affordable housing and community development requested herein; and

WHEREAS, these recommended awards for affordable housing and community development requested herein are as set forth in B.T. 21-001, attached hereto as Exhibit 1 and made a part hereof; now, therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Appropriation. There is hereby appropriated the sum of \$6,571,550.00 to the City of Jacksonville for award of CDBG Program funds made pursuant to the Commission's 2020-2021 Universal Cycle relating to affordable housing and community development, and to other City departments as appropriate for the remaining awards, and the City of Jacksonville is authorized to enter into federal program contracts as appropriate and expend those funds in accordance

with awards identified in B.T. 21-001. The sum of \$6,571,550.00 is hereby appropriated from the indicated sums in the accounts listed in subsection (a) to the accounts listed in subsection (b) of B.T. 21-001, attached hereto and made a part hereof:

(C) Explanation of Appropriation.

> The funding above is CDBG program funding received from United States Department of Housing Development. Such funding will be spent for public services, economic development, public facilities, and any costs associated with administration or delivery of the program.

Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation set forth in Section 1 above is to expend the 2020-2021 available federal income received from the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development, and award the federal contracts (as appropriate) for the CDBG program and funding to organizations and the amounts, all as set forth in B.T. 21-001.

Section 3. Additional authority. In the event a subrecipient is unable or unwilling to accept an award of funds, the funds may be reallocated to the next eligible awardee using the same method and criteria normally applied by the Commission.

Further Council Action. Section 4. If the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development approves a different allocation of funds than is appropriated by this ordinance, then the Mayor shall submit a supplementary budget to City Council for approval in accordance with the actual allocation received.

Execution of Documents. Section 5. The Mayor, his

designee, and the Corporation Secretary are hereby authorized to execute and deliver any and all documents necessary to effectuate the purpose set forth in Section 2 above.

Section 6. Authorization of Positions. There are hereby authorized the positions more fully described in R.C. 21-001, attached hereto as Exhibit 2 and incorporated herein by this reference.

Section 7. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
