BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

(c) Explanation of Appropriation:

The funding above represents an appropriation of a \$249,938 grant from the Federal Emergency Management Agency, distributed by the Florida Department of Emergency Management, and an appropriation of \$62,484.50 in General Fund Operating Reserves for the required 25% City match, for installation of wind resistant bay doors and hurricane shutters at the County Port Security Disaster Warehouse. The grant period commences upon execution of the Federally-Funded Subaward and Grant Agreement by both parties and continues through February 29, 2024.

Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 1 is to fund the installation of code compliant wind resistant bay doors and hurricane shutters at the County Port Security Disaster Warehouse (one warehouse building) located at 909 Haines Street, Jacksonville, Florida 32206 (the "Project"). These new bay doors and hurricane-rated shutters will meet the wind speed requirements in the area to prevent wind damage to this facility. All materials utilized will provide protection against 146 mile per hour winds or the wind speed protection and impact requirements of the Florida Building Code at the time the permits are issued. A copy of the Federally-Funded Subaward Grant Agreement (Agreement Number: H0795) providing the terms and conditions relative to receipt and expenditure of the grant funds has been placed On File with the Office of Legislative Services.

Section 3. Capital Improvement Plan Amendment. Ordinance 2021-505-E, adopting the 2022-2026 Five-Year Capital Improvement Plan (the "CIP") for the City and certain of its independent agencies, is hereby amended to provide additional funding for completion of the

Project as more fully described in the Project Information Sheet 1 2 attached hereto as **Exhibit 2** and incorporated herein by this reference.
