8 AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING SURPLUS PERSONAL
9 PROPERTY OF THE CITY; DECLARING THAT CERTAIN
10 2015 CHEVROLET 3500HD 6.0L V8 HORTON RESCUE UNIT
11 (VIN 1GB3CZCG1FF180231, VEHICLE NUMBER 3526-30)
12 VALUED AT APPROXIMATELY \$7,000 AND THAT CERTAIN
13 2004 PIERCE DASH PUMPER CAT C-12 IN6 FIRE TRUCK
14 (VIN 4P1CD01W54A004380 15833, VEHICLE NUMBER
15 3355-10) VALUED AT APPROXIMATELY \$4,000 TO BE
16 SURPLUS TO THE NEEDS OF THE CITY AND AUTHORIZING
17 THE APPROPRIATE OFFICIALS OF THE CITY TO
18 TRANSFER TITLE OF SAID PROPERTY TO THE FORT
19 MYERS BEACH FIRE CONTROL DISTRICT, LOCATED AT
20 100 VOORHIS STREET, FORT MYERS BEACH, FLORIDA
21 33931, FOR USE IN THE PROVISION OF EMERGENCY
22 SERVICES IN THE FORT MYERS BEACH FIRE CONTROL
23 DISTRICT, AT NO COST, IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION
24 122.812(C), *ORDINANCE CODE*; DESIGNATING THE
25 JACKSONVILLE FIRE AND RESCUE DEPARTMENT TO
26 MONITOR ACTUAL USE OF SAID PROPERTY; PROVIDING
27 FOR A REVERTER; REQUESTING EMERGENCY PASSAGE
28 UPON INTRODUCTION; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

30 **BE IT ORDAINED** by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

31 **Section 1. Declaration of Surplus.** The City hereby

1 declares that certain 2015 Chevrolet 3500HD 6.0L V8 Horton Rescue
2 Unit (VIN 1GB3CZCG1FF180231, vehicle number 3526-30) valued at
3 approximately \$7,000 and that certain 2004 Pierce Dash Pumper CAT C-
4 12 IN6 Fire Truck (VIN 4P1CD01W54A004380 15833, vehicle number 3355-
5 10) valued at approximately \$4,000 (collectively, the "Subject
6 Property"), to be surplus to the needs of the City of Jacksonville
7 and authorizes the appropriate City officials to transfer title of
8 the Subject Property to the Fort Myers Beach Fire Control District,
9 located at 100 Voorhis Street, Fort Myers Beach, Florida 33931, at
10 no cost, pursuant to Section 122.812(c), *Ordinance Code*. A copy of
11 the certificate from the Chief of Procurement certifying compliance
12 with provisions of Chapter 122, *Ordinance Code*, is attached hereto
13 as **Revised Exhibit 1**, labeled as "Revised Exhibit 1, Rev
14 Certification, October 25, 2022 - Floor", and incorporated herein by
15 this reference. Copies of the property transfer forms are attached
16 hereto as **Exhibit 2**.

17 **Section 2. Public Purpose.** The surplus vehicles are needed
18 by the Fort Myers Beach Fire Control District to rebuild their
19 emergency services fleet after loss of their fire and rescue vehicles
20 during Hurricane Ian. The City of Jacksonville finds that providing
21 these surplussed vehicles to the Fort Myers Beach Fire Control
22 District to be used for the provision of critical emergency services
23 for the Fort Myers Beach community is a valid public purpose.

24 **Section 3. Jacksonville Fire and Rescue Department to**
25 **Monitor Actual Use of Subject Property.** The Jacksonville Fire and
26 Rescue Department will be the designated agency to monitor the Fort
27 Myers Beach Fire Control District's use of the Subject Property in
28 accordance with the purposes set forth herein.

29 **Section 4. Reverter.** The disposition authorized herein is
30 conditioned upon the Fort Myers Beach Fire Control District using the
31 said vehicles for the purposes set forth herein and is conditioned

1 upon the Fort Myers Beach Fire Control District's agreeing to convey
2 and physically return the vehicles back to the City of Jacksonville,
3 at no cost to the City of Jacksonville, in the event that the vehicles
4 are not used for those purposes.

5 **Section 5. Requesting Emergency Passage Upon Introduction**
6 **Pursuant to Council Rule 4.901 Emergency.** Emergency passage upon
7 introduction of this legislation is requested. The nature of the
8 emergency is that the Fort Myers Beach Fire Control District has an
9 immediate need to restore critical emergency services in Fort Myers
10 Beach community. The Fort Myers Beach Fire Control District has
11 requested donation of fire and rescue vehicles to help rebuild their
12 emergency services fleet after experiencing the devastating loss of
13 much of their own fleet during Hurricane Ian.

14 **Section 6. Effective Date.** This Ordinance shall become
15 effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective
16 without the Mayor's signature.
