WHEREAS, Charles Spencer was born and raised in the East 21st Street Community four blocks from the Talleyrand waterfront and, after graduating from Matthew W. Gilbert High School, he went to work at the port at the age of 19; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Spencer found his calling working for the port, quickly rising through the ranks and earning the respect of his peers, being elected President of the International Longshoreman's Association ("ILA") Local 1408 at the age of 19; and

WHEREAS, in addition to serving with the ILA, Mr. Spencer has been a leading community advocate for labor throughout his career, having held top leadership posts with the A. Philip Randolph Institute, including Florida State Chapter President and National Board of Directors member; and

WHEREAS, through the ILA, Mr. Spencer established the ILA Scholarship Fund, which focuses on providing scholarships in the form of financial assistance to academic high achievers and/or financially disadvantaged graduating high school seniors and returning college students from the Jacksonville area; and

WHEREAS, the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People ("NAACP") has recently recognized Charles Spencer for his "significant contributions to racial equity and commitment to fairness in the workplace" by awarding him the 2024 Benjamin L. Hooks "Keeper of the Flame" Award on July 16th, 2024, at the NAACP's 115th National Convention; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the city of Jacksonville:

Section 1. The City Council hereby honors and commends Charles Spencer for his consistent presence and leadership in the Jacksonville community, which has and will continue to lift people up to pursue fulfilling and dignified work. The Council particularly congratulates him on his receipt of the NAACP's 2024 Benjamin L.
