Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 1 is to provide funding for the design and construction of the Project. These funds will cover related costs for design and construction of a multi-use bicycle and pedestrian path with bicycle pavement markings and signage for segments of UNF Drive. The specific portions are UNF West from 9A to UNF East and UNF East from UNF West to Kernan Boulevard.

Section 3. CIP Amendment. Ordinance 2022-505-E, being the 2022-2027 Five-Year Capital Improvement Program for the City and certain of its independent agencies, is hereby amended to provide additional funding for the Project. The project is more fully described in the Project Information Sheet, attached hereto as Exhibit 2, and incorporated herein by this reference. The Council finds that the deferral of this amendment of the CIP until the next annual budget and CIP review will be detrimental to the best interests of the community because such deferral will result in unnecessary delay of the Project which will provide pedestrian safety.

Pursuant to Section 122.605(c), Ordinance Code, enactment of this ordinance requires the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the Council members present at the meeting because of the CIP amendment set forth in this section. This ordinance shall constitute an amendment to Ordinance 2022-505-E. In all other respects, the Five-Year Capital Improvement Program approved by Ordinance 2022-505-E shall continue in full force and effect.

Section 4. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
