WHEREAS, Susan Grandin, a native of Atlanta, earned her bachelor's degree in landscape architecture from the University of Florida and her law degree from the Walter F. George School of Law at Mercer University; and

WHEREAS, following her graduation from UF, Ms. Grandin was a practicing landscape architect with The Haskell Company and Reynolds, Smith and Hills for 9 years before attending law school, after which she joined the Office of General Counsel (OGC) in 1992 and served 5 years in the Environmental and Land Use Department, including serving as counsel to the Jacksonville Planning Commission and the Historic Preservation Commission; and

WHEREAS, Susan Grandin left the OGC to become the Northeast Florida Field Office Director for the Trust for Public Land and later opened a private law practice, The Preservation Law Group, which advised clients in land use and real estate matters, particularly the preservation and protection of military installations and civil airports from the encroachment of incompatible land uses; and
