• Presentation on UF Downtown campus

Ms. Boyer, DIA, and Kurt Dudas, UF Vice President for Strategic Initiatives, spoke about the UF graduate school campus that will be located downtown. Mr. Dudas talked about the site selection in LaVilla neighborhood. He said that classes in the graduate program will commence this fall in an existing building, with the intent to construct a flagship building sometime later. Ms. Boyer shared a map and rendering of where the campus will be located near the convention center. She said that the full redevelopment agreement legislation is expected to be filed in May, for council's consideration. Ms. Boyer talked about the disposition process for the City's four parcels, the purpose and timeline for the various construction projects, and the historical designation of, and how that impacts, the train station parcel. She indicated that the train station, when renovated, will have shops and restaurants like the Denver Union Station.

Council Member Peluso asked about public access to train station parcel after renovation and whether there will be trains and a functional rail system.

Council Member Salem asked who owns the 801 W. Bay property. Ms. Boyer said it is owned by a private entity (an LLC affiliated with Gateway) with whom they are negotiating a purchase agreement with potential for a land swap. Council Member Salem asked how long the property has been owned by Gateway, and Ms. Boyer estimated one year. Council Member Salem noted that the other parcels for this project are owned by the City already. He asked if UF was using space in the JEA building. Mr. Dudas said it was considered but a different site was selected, and he said that the first classes will be held in the building located at 801 W. Bay St.

Council Member Miller asked about parking, and the plan for a location for a new convention center.

Council Member Clark-Murray asked about the future of the convention center and Expo Hall, noting the frequent senior events held in that location. She asked about the overall project cost for the UF campus. Mr. Weinstein, Mayor's Office, said that the \$50 million in City funds previously appropriated has not been touched to date, and that there will be an additional portion of City funding requested with the upcoming redevelopment agreement.

• Presentation on Council President White's 100 Tree Challenge - Justin Gearhart, Arborist - Public Works Department

Mr. Gearhart described the 100 tree challenge program initiated by CP White. Mr. Gearhart said that the goal is to plant 100 trees on public property throughout each council district. Council Member Amaro asked for a list of planting sites in council district 1. Council Member Boylan asked about the criteria for site selection. Mr. Gearhart said that soil conditions, construction and proximity to utilities are considered. Council Member Clark-Murray asked about which tree species will be planted. Council Member Peluso asked about planting on or near state roads and cooperation with FDOT. Council Member Miller asked for the total project cost. Mr. Gearhart said that the cost per planting varies, but that it is roughly \$2000 per tree planted. Council Member J. Carlucci complimented the trees planted along Baymeadows Rd.

Council President White proposed an amendment. Approved unanimously.

Council Member Salem asked about the 20 year length of the agreement. Eric Fuller, Public Works, explained landfill gas emissions over time, and the time needed forTrail Ridge Energy to recoup their capital investment over time. Council Member Boylan asked about the overall capital investment, which is estimated to be in the tens of millions.

Council Member Amaro asked about the benefit to the City. Mr. Fuller talked about the financial benefit to having an existing vendor on site, the City's revenue for management of liquid waste and the fuel evaporator on site, and how there is no capital investment by the City.

• Enters into an Amended and Restated Landfill Gas Rights Agreement with Trail Ridge Energy (TRE) that:

- Extends term of agreement 20 years to March 2049, with a 5 year extension option

- Extends gas rights to expanded portion of landfill and any future expansion

- Authorizes development of second TRE collection and processing site

• Amended agreement will result in the following additional compensation received by the City:

- \$1,000,000 towards the installation of a 500,000-gallon leachate storage tank

- Through 4/1/29, TRE will pay City \$0.25 per unit of gas generated at the site, estimated by Public Works to be \$200,000 annually

- After 4/1/29, TRE will remit 10% of gross revenues to the City as payment for the gas rights, estimated by Public Works to be \$2,000,000 annually

- These additional payments to the City will be reduced by tangible personal property taxes paid by TRE

• TRE will continue to pay City \$193,500 annually for use of Premise

• City will pay up to \$200,000 per year to TRE for operation of the City's evaporator as well as reimburse for the cost plus 10% of all associated equipment and supplies (per Public Works, the City is currently paying approximately \$600,000 annually to the landfill operator for this service)

There was discussion about the incremental fee increase included in the bill. Mr. Reingold, OGC, explained the phased fee increase structure.

Council Member Carlucci offered an amendment that would increase the monthly rate to \$20 in year 2025, \$25 in 2026 and \$31.25 in 2027. (Failed 0-6)

Council Member Peluso said that the current fee is too low and he cautioned about incremental fee increases that have to be approved by council annually. Mr. Reingold explained that approval of the solid waste fee by council occurs annually if the fee increases, decreases or remains flat.

Council Member Miller talked about future large expenditures that will come before council, such as a new jail.

Council Member Arias talked about how service at the current rate is not sustainable or responsible.

Council Member Miller offered an amendment for a phased fee increase of \$27.00 in 2025, \$29.50 in 2026 \$32.00 in 2027. Approved 4-2 (CMs J. Carlucci and Peluso in opposition)

Council Member Carlucci explained the bill and how the reduction in solid waste fees based on income models the stormwater fee reduction. He said the bill aims to assist those with lower incomes to manage the increased solid waste fee.

Council Member Amaro spoke in opposition to waiving fees entirely. There was discussion about the merits of fee waiving compared with freezing fees at the current rate.

Council Member Miller offered a floor amendment to freeze the current rate for those who are eligible and require an annual application for renewal of the exemption from any assessment increases. Approved 4-2 (CMs Clark-Murray and Boylan in opposition)

Council Member Boylan made a motion to table this bill to have discussion on the amendment to this bill and for 2025-1. Motion failed 2-4 (CMs Clark-Murray and Boylan in the affirmative)
