AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING \$399,353.00 IN GRANT FUNDING FOR YEAR ONE OF A FIVE-YEAR GRANT FROM THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES FOR THE DUVAL COUNTY ADULT DRUG COURT PROGRAM, AS INITIATED BY B.T. 24-030; PROVIDING FOR CARRYOVER OF FUNDS TO SUBSEQUENT FISCAL YEARS; PROVIDING FOR CITY OVERSIGHT BY THE COURT ADMINISTRATION, DIRECTOR OF PROBLEM SOLVING COURTS; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

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BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:
Section 1. Appropriation. For the 2023-2024 fiscal year,

Duval County Adult Drug Court program. This appropriation is comprised of funds awarded for year one of the fiveyear grant and covers the period beginning September 30, 2023 through September 29, 2024. No City match is required.

6 Section 2. Carryover. The funds appropriated in Section 1 7 of this Ordinance shall not lapse but shall carryover into subsequent 8 fiscal years. The grantor allows funds to be carried over through a 9 waiver that can be requested by the Courts in the event grant funds 10 are not expended in the current fiscal year and are anticipated to 11 be spent in the next fiscal year.

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12 Section 3. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 1 is to provide additional funds for the Duval County Adult 13 Drug Court program. The funding will support the costs to expand the 14 15 substance and use disorder (SUD) treatment and recovery support services of the program. The funds will allow a continuum of care 16 17 for those in the program, including evidence-based and population appropriate prevention, harm reduction, treatment, and recovery 18 19 services, for individuals with SUD. Additionally, the funds will 20 allow the program to screen and assess individuals for the presence 21 of SUD and/or co-occurring substance use and mental disorders, screen 22 for infectious diseases for which those with SUD are at high risk. A 23 copy of the Notice of Award is attached hereto as **Exhibit 2** and 24 incorporated herein by this reference.

25 Section 4. Oversight. The Court Administration, Director 26 of Problem Solving Courts shall oversee the administration of the 27 Grant described herein, including providing reporting required by the 28 terms of the Grant.

29 Section 5. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become 30 effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective 31 without the Mayor's signature.
