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ORDINANCE 2024-364

AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING AVAILABLE ALL YEARS REVENUE AND REALLOCATING THE REMAINING BALANCE FROM COMPLETED PROJECTS WITHIN THE NORTHWEST ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT FUND AS FOLLOWS: \$200,000.00 TO THE FAILING NON-RESIDENTIAL SEPTIC TANK REPAIR/REPLACEMENT AND CONNECTION PROGRAM (THE "SEPTIC TANK PROGRAM"), COMPRISED OF \$80,250.00 FROM COMPLETED PROJECTS AND \$119,750.00 FROM ALL YEARS REVENUE, (2) \$5,767.00 FROM ALL YEARS REVENUE TO THE MOBILE MARKETS PROGRAM, AND (3) \$665,650.26 FROM ALL YEARS REVENUE TO THE NORTHWEST JEDC FUND CONTINGENCY ACOUNT, AND CLEANING UP FUND BALANCE APPROPRIATIONS IN THE ALL YEARS FUND, AS INITIATED BY B.T. 24-087; AMENDING THE SEPTIC TANK PROGRAM GRANT PROCESS; AUTHORIZING THE GENERAL COUNSEL TO PREPARE AN AGREEMENT ACCORDANCE WITH THE AMENDED SEPTIC TANK PROGRAM GRANT PROCESS; PROVIDING FOR CITY OVERSIGHT OF THE SEPTIC TANK PROGRAM AND GRANT PROCESS BY THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS AND THE OFFICE OF ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, in order to protect the environment and ensure that wastewater is treated properly, installing a proper septic system from the onset is crucial; and

WHEREAS, to aid with the cost, as well as promoting

environmentally secure septic systems while awaiting public sewer, a number of government, state and local agencies offer grants to help install new septic systems or repair existing ones; and

WHEREAS, grant money is awarded for specific need, in this case to install or improve septic systems and sewer connections, and progress will likely need to be monitored and recorded for the grants; and

WHEREAS, eligible projects may include repair or replacement of septic tanks and drain fields and connection to sewer for businesses whose systems are in failure as determined by septic tank contractors, certified plumbers or by other qualified persons as per subsection 64E-6.004(3), Florida Administrative Code (F.A.C.); and

WHEREAS, the Northwest Jacksonville Economic Development ("NWJED") funds are intended to improve the economy within the area boundaries; and

WHEREAS, the lack of infrastructure and strategic planning to provide infrastructure causes businesses to move outside of the area, thereby depleting the economy of the area; and

WHEREAS, the Council in Ordinance 2018-196-E enacted a grant process and established criteria for the Northwest Jacksonville Economic Development area entitled the "Failing Non-residential Septic Grant Process" which process was subsequently amended by Ordinance 2021-385-E and which set forth certain grant criteria and maximum grant amounts; now therefore

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Appropriation. For the 2023-2024 fiscal year, within the City's budget, there are hereby appropriated the indicated sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to the account(s) listed in subsection (b):

(c) Explanation of Appropriation: the appropriation above is appropriating available all years revenue balance and reallocating the balance from completed projects within the Northwest Economic Development Fund, as follows: (1) \$200,000.00 to the Septic Tank and Sewer Connection - Miscellaenous Grants and Aids account, comprised of \$80,250.00 from completed projects and \$119.750.00 from all years revenue, (2) \$5,767.00 from all years revenue to the Mobile Markets Program - Contingency account, and (3) \$665,650.26 from all years revenue to the Northwest JEDC Fund - Contingency account. This appropriation also removes the fund balance appropriations in the all years fund.

Section 2. Purpose of Appropriation. The purpose of the appropriation above is to provide funding to various NWJED programs including the Septic Tank Program and allocate all years revenue to contingency.

Section 3. Amending the Grant Process and Amounts. The amended Septic Tank Program grant process, including amended criteria and increased grant amounts, for the repair and replacement of non residential properties septic tanks and sewer connection are adopted as set forth in the "Failing Non-residential Septic Tank Repair/Replacement and Sewer Connection Program Grant Process" attached hereto as Exhibit 2.

Section 4. Authorizing the General Counsel to prepare Agreements in accordance with the Failing Non-residential Septic Tank Repair/Replacement and Sewer Connection Program Grant Process. The Office of General Counsel is authorized to prepare agreements between the grant recipients and the City of Jacksonville in compliance with
