WHEREAS, KIPP Bold City High School graduated its inaugural class of seniors in 2025, with a graduation rate of 97 percent, solidifying a high-quality K-12 pathway for Duval County students; and

WHEREAS, KIPP Jacksonville has fostered strong community partnerships, empowered families, and contributed to the broader educational ecosystem of Jacksonville, providing students with learning opportunities driven by the values of inclusive learning, team and family, continuous growth, high expectations for all, and a commitment to community; and
