AN ORDINANCE CONFIRMING THE APPOINTMENT OF SARAH A. SMITH, AS A MEMBER OF THE OPIOID AND SUBSTANCE DISORDER GRANTS COMMITTEE, AS A USE PEER SPECIALIST REPRESENTATIVE, PURSUANT TO SECTION 84.202, ORDINANCE CODE, FOR A FIRST FULL TERM ENDING ON JUNE 30, 2025; WAIVING COUNCIL RULE 4.1101 (APPEARANCE BEFORE COMMITTEE), COUNCIL RULES, AS TO THE REQUIREMENT THAT THE APPOINTEE, PRIOR TO CONFIRMATION, SHALL APPEAR BEFORE THE ТΟ WHICH CONSIDERATION OF COMMITTEE THE APPOINTMENT HAS BEEN REFERRED; REQUESTING ONE CYCLE EMERGENCY PASSAGE; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

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19 WHEREAS, Ordinance 2023-350-E established the Opioid and 20 Substance Use Disorder Grants Committee (the "Committee") to act as 21 an advisory body for the City of Jacksonville and to review, evaluate 22 and score grant applications to fund projects and programs aimed at 23 combatting the opioid crisis; and

WHEREAS, Section 84.202, Ordinance Code, outlines the composition of the Committee which shall consist of seven voting members, three of whom shall be appointed by the Mayor and confirmed by Council and three of whom shall be appointed by the Council President and confirmed by Council; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council President shall each appoint
one member to the Committee from each of the following categories:
(i) Mental Health Professional, (ii) Peer Specialist, and (iii)

1 Healthcare Professional; and

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2 WHEREAS, the members of the Committee are chosen to provide 3 knowledge of needed services, shall demonstrate an interest in the 4 impact of opioid-related programs in the community, and a willingness 5 to participate fully in the process; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

7 Section 1. Appointment. The Council hereby confirms the 8 Council President's appointment of Sarah A. Smith, a Duval County 9 resident, to the Opioid and Substance Use Disorder Grants Committee, 10 as a Peer Specialist representative, in accordance with Section 11 84.202, Ordinance Code, for a first full term expiring on June 30, 12 2025.

Waiver of Council Rule 4.1101 (Appearance Before 13 Section 2. 14 Committee), Council Rules. Council Rule 4.1101 (Appearance Before 15 Committee), Council Rules, is hereby waived as to the requirement that the appointee, prior to confirmation, shall be required to appear 16 before the committee to which consideration of the appointment has 17 18 been referred. A waiver is required because the appointee is unable 19 to appear before the Rules Committee due to a scheduling conflict. 20 This waiver will allow the Rules Committee and Council to act upon 21 this appointment in a timely manner to give the Committee sufficient 22 time to schedule organizational and training meetings to prepare for 23 the initial grant cycle and to allow the appointee to attend and participate in those meetings as a member of the Committee. 24

Section 3. Requesting One Cycle Emergency Passage Pursuant to Council Rule 4.901 Emergency. One cycle emergency passage of this legislation is requested. The nature of the emergency is that applications for the initial Opioid Settlement Proceeds Grants cycle (Fiscal Year 2023-2024) must be submitted by no later than September 30, 2023. The City Council would like to seat the Committee members as soon as possible to provide the members and staff time to schedule

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their initial organizational meetings to prepare for the grant cycle. 1 Section 4. Effective Date.
