Mary Staffopoulos, OGC, explained the LUZ amendment. Approved 5-2 (Boylan and Peluso in opposition)

Council Member Peluso spoke in opposition to removing the "missing middle" language from this bill. He talked about thoughtful urban planning and housing options that incentivize young folks to move to Jacksonville. Ms. Parola, Planning Department, explained that the amendment removes language encouraging missing middle policies, but that density changes can still be made with council approval. Council Member Boylan talked about the CQLI Special Committee recommendation for missing middle policies.

Council Member Amaro said that his constituent consensus is one of opposition to the missing middle. Council Member Clark-Murray indicated that the missing middle map did not correlate geographically with future population growth projections.

Council Member Salem talked about the sizeable investment that owners make when buying a house.

Council Member Arias said this legislation seems rushed. Ms. Parola explained the timeline and the role of public input.

Council Member Boylan said that missing middle planning diversifies housing stock.

Mr. Peterson explained the amendment. Approved unanimously.  
Council Member Amaro asked about the lease terms and the vehicle. Chief Powers, JFRD, described the unit's capabilities, with a mobile CT, 24/7 neurologist on call, and specialized paramedics and technicians. He explained that the staff salaries will be paid on a reimbursement basis by UF Health with state grant funds. The state grant provides for 3 mobile stroke units, one in Alachua County, one in Jacksonville and one in the Villages. UF will own the vehicle and the City will lease it at a rate of \$1 per year. CP White noted that Jacksonville is lucky to have the mobile stroke unit. Council Member Salem asked about where the unit would be based. Chief Powers said it will be based at Station 64. Chief Powers talked about the frequency of stroke alert calls for JFRD assistance, roughly 2000 per year. There was discussion about future expansion of the program to include 4 units to service all quadrants of the city.
