Council Auditor Kim Taylor to discuss Report #890: Quarterly Summary for the Six Months Ended March 31, 2025

Ms. Taylor spoke about the details in the Quarterly Summary handout. She talked about independent authorities' budgets. Ms. Taylor reviewed positive and negative variances, and projected revenue and expenditures. She talked about the General Fund, JSO's budget, the solid waste fund, and other departmental budgets.

Council Member Salem talked about reserving the roughly \$22 million in surplus funds. Council Member Lahnen asked about year end balances. He asked about the Group Health Fund and debt service savings. Ms. Moyer spoke about the debt management fund.

Council Member Lahnen requested a vacancy report with the length of vacancy noted.

Council Member Howland asked about the hologram at the airport, and about the process for fund projections.

Council Member Freeman asked about the time lapse for some project funding, specifically for the UF Trauma Center.

Council Member Lahnen asked if there are Mayoral Transition funds remaining.

Council Member Peluso asked whether City vacancies are related to salary deficiencies.

Alan Cottrill, Avant Construction, spoke about his experience with downtown projects and the funding arrangement for the Juliette Balcony project, wherein the City is providing roughly \$2.5 million and \$3.3 million will be covered by the developer. Steve Kelley, DIA talked about DIA's focus on a defined core downtown, particularly Laura and Hogan Streets.

Council Member Lahnen expressed opposition to the bill, noting other City funding obligations and the low return on investment for this project.

Council Member Howland said that historical restoration projects tend to have lower ROIs, and he said that good projects should be funded and to do so sometimes other things will be funded less. He reiterated a request he made to DIA for a prioritized list of projects.

Council Member Arias asked about whether or not TIF dollars could fund this project. Mr. Kelley explained that the DPRP program was set up to be funded by the General Fund.

Mr. Cottrill spoke about the details of the mixed-use project, to include 8 affordable housing units and retail. There was discussion about the definitions of affordable and workforce housing.

Council Member Arias asked if the project is eligible to count towards the City's obligation through the CBA, and he said he'd like to see 20 more small projects like this one.

Council Member Pittman asked about clawbacks for non-completion. Mr. Kelley explained that the funding is provided to the developer after the project is 100% completed. She also asked about JSEB participation. Mr. Cottrill said his company is extensively involved with the JSEB program, for this project and previous ones.

Council Member Freeman talked about the City's financial constraints.

Council President White indicated his support for this project.

Council Member Carlucci talked about the impeccable quality of Avant's work and the importance of catalyst projects in the downtown core.

Council Member Peluso spoke about the importance of the DPRP program.

• Authorizes Downtown Preservation and Revitalization Program (DPRP) Loans of \$2,560,000 (of the total, \$2,048,000 can be forgiven and \$512,000 will be repaid with interest), subject to future appropriation by Council

• DPRP funding will be used to renovate and rehabilitate the building located at 225 N. Laura Street into a minimum of 1,750 sq. ft. of leasable commercial retail/restaurant space on the first floor and a total of 4 one-bedroom and 4 studio apartments located on the second and third floors

• Construction must commence within 6 months of the effective date of the agreement and be completed within 18 months of the commencement date

• DIA has calculated an ROI of 0.50 based on a 20-year valuation
