WHEREAS, Indigenous Peoples' Day is a holiday that celebrates and honors Native American peoples and commemorates their histories and cultures; and

WHEREAS, the Jacksonville City Council recognizes that the observance of Indigenous Peoples' Day is part of the history and heritage of Florida and of the United States; and

WHEREAS, the Jacksonville City Council encourages all citizens to learn more about the Indigenous people in our community and their way of life; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. The City Council hereby declares October 9, 2023, as "Indigenous Peoples' Day" and urges Jacksonville's citizens to learn about the long and rich history of the Indigenous Peoples who have inhabited what is now Jacksonville and Northeast Florida for thousands of years.
