JOYCE; REQUESTING EMERGENCY PASSAGE UPON
INTRODUCTION; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Sterling Joyce, a native of Georgia, spent his summers as a teenager working at the Ponte Vedra Inn and Club with his father learning the hospitality business from the ground up; and

WHEREAS, after traveling the world as a young man in the U.S. Air Force he returned to the area and made the Jacksonville Beaches his home and worked in several capacities in the hospitality industry, eventually taking on his most well-known role as the dapperly dressed maître d'hôtel of the Casa Marina Hotel and Restaurant in Jacksonville Beach; and

WHEREAS, Sterling Joyce was a fixture and the "unofficial mayor" at the Beaches for more than four decades, catering to the desires of his clientele at the Casa Marina, attending events of all sorts at the Beaches, and imparting his inimitable style and infectious enthusiasm for Beaches life wherever he went; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Joyce was a charter member when the first class of "Beaches Legends" was named in 2014 and retired from the Casa Marina in 2021 after 20 years of legendary service to its guests; and

WHEREAS, the City Council was saddened to hear of the recent

passing of the legendary Sterling Joyce just a few days before his $74^{\rm th}$ birthday, which he would have celebrated, as he has for many years, by requesting donations of toys to local non-profit organizations for distribution to deserving children in lieu of gifts for himself; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. The City Council hereby honors and commemorates the life and accomplishments of Beaches legend Sterling Joyce, extending to his family and countless friends and admirers its deepest sympathy on the occasion of his passing. Mr. Joyce epitomized a life service to others, and boundless enthusiasm for life. His sparkling personality and sincere love for the Beaches life will be long remembered and greatly missed.

Section 2. Requesting emergency passage upon introduction pursuant to Council Rule 4.901. Emergency passage upon introduction of this Resolution is requested to convey the community's sympathy to Mr. Joyce's family in a timely manner.

Section 3. Effective Date. This Resolution shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
