8 AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING \$30,000,000.00 FROM  
9 THE SPECIAL COMMITTEE ON PARKS AND QUALITY OF  
10 LIFE CONSTRUCTION PROJECT FOR CONSTRUCTION OF  
11 THE FOLLOWING PROJECTS: (1) \$5,000,000 TO THE  
12 ARTIST WALK EXTENSION FROM RIVERSIDE AVE. TO  
13 PARK ST., (2) \$5,000,000 TO JAMES P. SMALL PARK,  
14 (3) \$5,000,000 TO CECIL FIELD MASTER PLAN -  
15 PHASE II, (4) \$2,800,000 TO MYRTLE AVENUE AREA  
16 COURT COMPLEX, (5) \$2,500,000 TO 9A BAYMEADOWS  
17 REGIONAL PARK AMENITIES, (6) \$1,350,000 TO  
18 CLANZEL T. BROWN PARK, (7) \$1,500,000 TO DREW  
19 PARK- FIELD IMPROVEMENTS, (8) \$6,000,004 TO  
20 COUNTYWIDE COMMUNITY AND SENIOR CENTER  
21 IMPROVEMENTS, AND (9) \$849,996 TO SECURITY  
22 CAMERAS, SAFETY EQUIPMENT AND ELECTRICAL  
23 UPGRADES; AMENDING THE 2022-2026 FIVE-YEAR  
24 CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PLAN APPROVED BY ORDINANCE  
25 2021-505-E TO PROVIDE FUNDING FOR THE PROJECTS  
26 IDENTIFIED HEREIN; PROVIDING FOR A LIMITED  
27 WAIVER OF SECTION 122.605, ORDINANCE CODE, AS TO  
28 FUNDS DESIGNATED FOR COUNTYWIDE COMMUNITY AND  
29 SENIOR CENTER IMPROVEMENTS; DISTRICT COUNCIL  
30 EXPENDITURES FOR SECURITY CAMERAS, SAFETY

EQUIPMENT, AND ELECTRICAL UPGRADES REQUIRE COMPLIANCE WITH SECTION 106.315, ORDINANCE CODE; PROVIDING FOR OVERSIGHT BY THE DEPARTMENT OF PARKS, RECREATION AND COMMUNITY SERVICES; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

**BE IT ORDAINED** by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

**Section 1. Appropriation.** For the 2021-2022 fiscal year, within the City's budget, there is hereby appropriated the indicated sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to the account(s) listed in subsection (b):

(The account information is attached hereto as **Revised Exhibit 1**, labeled as "Revised Exhibit 1, Rev B.T., January 31, 2022 - NCSPHS" and incorporated herein by this reference)

(c) Explanation of Appropriation:

The funding above is from the Special Committee on Parks and Quality of Life construction account to the Parks, Recreation and Community Services Department for the parks construction projects described further in Section 2.

**Section 2. Purpose.** The purpose of the appropriation in Section 1 is to provide funding the Special Committee on Parks and Quality of Life construction account, to provide funding for construction of the following projects: (1) \$5,000,000 to the Artist Walk Extension from Riverside Ave. to Park St. for hardscape and recreational amenities including a skate park, (2) \$5,000,000 to James P. Small Park for new lighting, field turf, restroom and museum upgrades, and design for a water park, (3) \$5,000,000 to Cecil Field

1 Master Plan Phase II for development of a new regional ballfield  
2 complex, (4) \$2,800,000 to Myrtle Avenue Area Court Complex, (5)  
3 \$2,500,000 to 9A Baymeadows Regional Park Amenities for synthetic  
4 turf baseball fields and a multi-use field, (6) \$1,350,000 to Clanzel  
5 T. Brown Park for an outdoor covered multiuse court/event space, (7)  
6 \$1,500,000 to Drew Park - Field Improvements for synthetic turf  
7 baseball field improvements, (8) \$6,000,004 to Countywide Community  
8 and Senior Center Improvements for building, technology, pool and  
9 outdoor space upgrades at various community centers, senior centers  
10 and recreational locations, collectively the "Projects", and (9)  
11 \$849,996 to Security Cameras, Safety Equipment and Electrical  
12 Upgrades.

13       **Section 3. Capital Improvement Plan Amendment.** Ordinance  
14 2021-505-E, adopting the 2022-2026 Five-Year Capital Improvement Plan  
15 (the "CIP") for the City and certain of its independent agencies, is  
16 hereby amended to provide funding for the Projects, as more fully  
17 described in the Project Information Sheets, attached hereto as  
18 **Revised Exhibit 2**, labeled as "Revised Exhibit 2, Rev CIP, January  
19 31, 2022 - NCSPHS" and incorporated herein by this reference. The  
20 City Council finds that the deferral of this amendment of the CIP  
21 until the next annual budget and CIP review will be detrimental to  
22 the best interests of the community because such deferral will result  
23 in unnecessary delay of the Project. Pursuant to Section 122.605(c),  
24 *Ordinance Code*, enactment of this Ordinance requires the affirmative  
25 vote of two-thirds of the City Council members present at the meeting  
26 because of the CIP amendment set forth in this section. This Ordinance  
27 shall constitute an amendment to Ordinance 2021-505-E. In all other  
28 respects, the Five-Year Capital Improvement Plan approved by  
29 Ordinance 2021-505-E shall remain unchanged and continue in full  
30 force and effect.

31       **Section 4. Providing for a Limited Waiver of Section 122.605,**

1 **Ordinance Code, as to Funds Designated for Countywide Community and**  
2 **Senior Center Improvements.** The City's 2021-2022 approved budget  
3 included \$50 million designated for City Park and Quality of Life  
4 projects and improvements and identified same in Ordinance 2021-505-  
5 E. The Special Committee on Parks and Quality of Life has identified  
6 improvements totaling \$30 million dollars, approximately \$24 million  
7 is contained within this designated funding for various parks capital  
8 improvement projects identified in Section 3 herein. At this time,  
9 project costs and work descriptions for 12 Community Centers in the  
10 amount of \$6,000,004 is not available to be included in this Ordinance  
11 as required by Section 122.605(b). For the limited purpose of projects  
12 in the 12 Community and Senior Centers projects that are valued  
13 between \$100,000 and \$500,000 and falling under the \$6 million  
14 designated by the Special Committee on Parks and Quality of Life and  
15 appropriated by this ordinance, the Council hereby waives all  
16 inconsistent provisions of Section 122.605, *Ordinance Code*, to allow  
17 the Administration to proceed with these projects without the need  
18 for additional City Council approval.

19 **Section 5. District Council Expenditures for Security**  
20 **Cameras, Safety Equipment and Electrical Upgrades Require Compliance**  
21 **with Section 106.315, Ordinance Code.** Expenditures for security  
22 cameras, safety equipment, and electrical upgrades made pursuant to  
23 this appropriation shall comply with the applicable provisions of  
24 Section 106.315 (District Council Expenditures), *Ordinance Code*.  
25 Funds appropriated in this Ordinance for security cameras, safety  
26 equipment, and electrical upgrades must be committed before June 30,  
27 2023, failure to do so will cause funds to revert to the account of  
28 origin.

29 **Section 6. Oversight.** The Parks, Recreation and  
30 Community Services Department shall oversee the projects described  
31 herein.

1           **Section 7.           Effective Date.**   This Ordinance shall become  
2 effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective  
3 without the Mayor's signature.
