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## ORDINANCE 2024-931

5 AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING \$50,000 FROM A 6 GENERAL FUND OPERATING SPECIAL COUNCIL 7 CONTINGENCY ACCOUNT TO THE GENERAL FUND 8 OPERATING SUBSIDIES AND CONTRIBUTIONS TO PRIVATE 9 ORG ACCOUNT TO PROVIDE CITY GRANT FUNDING TO HOPE ACROSS THE GLOBE, INC. ("HATG") FOR THE 10 HOPE MENTAL HEALTH AND BEHAVIORAL MEDICINE 11 PROGRAM (THE "PROGRAM") AS DESCRIBED HEREIN; 12 WAIVING SECTION 118.107 (NONPROFITS TO RECEIVE 13 FUNDING THROUGH A COMPETITIVE EVALUATED AWARD 14 PROCESS), PART 1 (GENERAL PROVISIONS), CHAPTER 15 118 (CITY GRANTS), ORDINANCE CODE, TO ALLOW FOR 16 A DIRECT CONTRACT WITH HOPE ACROSS THE GLOBE, 17 INC.; APPROVING, AND AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR, OR 18 HER DESIGNEE, AND THE CORPORATION SECRETARY TO 19 20 EXECUTE AND DELIVER ON BEHALF OF THE CITY A GRANT 21 AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF JACKSONVILLE AND 22 HATG FOR THE PROGRAM; PROVIDING FOR OVERSIGHT BY 23 THE GRANTS AND CONTRACT COMPLIANCE DIVISION OF 24 THE FINANCE DEPARTMENT; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE 25 DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:
Section 1. Appropriation. For the 2024-2025 fiscal year,
within the City's budget, there is hereby appropriated the indicated
sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to the account(s)

Explanation of Appropriation: (C)

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The funding above is an appropriation of \$50,000 from a General Fund Operating Special Council Contingency account to the General Fund Operating Subsidies and Contributions to Private Org account to provide a grant to HOPE Across the Globe, Inc. ("HATG") for the HOPE Mental Health and Behavioral Medicine Program (the "Program") as described herein.

Section 2. 15 Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 1 is to provide grant funds from the City of Jacksonville to 16 17 HOPE Across the Globe, Inc. for the HOPE Mental Health and Behavioral Medicine Program as described in Exhibit 2, attached hereto and 18 19 incorporated herein by this reference. The Program was designed to 20 increase mental health and behavioral medicine services for Duval 21 County residents suffering from HIV, AIDS, Hepatitis B, Hepatitis C, 22 and sexually transmitted diseases or infections as well as those who 23 are at risk of contracting these conditions. The Program is based on 24 need rather than an individual's ability to pay and many patients 25 served through the Program are uninsured or underinsured which results 26 in them receiving insufficient, inadequate or no medical or psycho-social care to address their various medical conditions. This 27 28 often results in these individuals succumbing to negative social 29 determinants (such as depression, anxiety, stigma, food insecurity, 30 underemployment, learning disabilities, etc.), failing to take their 31 medications due to these comorbidities, and an increase in the risk

of rising rates of HIV/AIDS, sexually transmitted infections and Hepatitis in the community. The City funds will assist with the expansion of the Program by paying a portion of the salary for a Care Coordinator with the remainder of the funds being used to cover the costs for professional services from behavioral and mental health professionals to allow HATG to add capacity and reach more individuals in need.

Section 3. Waiver of Section 118.107, Ordinance Code. 8 The 9 provisions of Section 118.107 (Nonprofits to receive funding through 10 a competitive evaluated award process), Part 1 (General Provisions), Chapter 118 (City Grants), Ordinance Code, are hereby waived to allow 11 for a direct contract with HATG. This waiver is justified because 12 HATG provides a Program that allows Florida-licensed, well-qualified 13 medical professionals to address the roots of mental health and 14 behavioral maladies for some of Duval County's most vulnerable 15 residents. These services are provided weekdays, evenings and 16 17 weekends to ensure they do not conflict with the patients' work or 18 education schedule so they can remain on track in their day-to-day lives while also addressing significant and often chronic medical 19 20 conditions.

21 Section 4. Approval and Authorization to Execute. There is 22 hereby approved, and the Mayor, or her designee, and the Corporation 23 Secretary are hereby authorized to execute and deliver on behalf of 24 the City a grant agreement with HOPE Across the Globe, Inc. in an 25 amount not-to-exceed \$50,000, subject to the Term Sheet and Budget 26 more particularly described in **Exhibit 2**, for a term commencing on 27 October 1, 2024 through September 30, 2025, and all other contracts 28 and documents, including extensions, renewals and amendments to the 29 agreement, and to otherwise take all action necessary to effectuate the intent of this Ordinance, subject to appropriate legal review and 30 approval by the General Counsel, or his or her designee, and the 31

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City's Risk Management Division for appropriate insurance and
 indemnification requirements in accordance with Section 128.601,
 Ordinance Code.

4 Section 5. Oversight Department. The Grants and Contract 5 Compliance Division of the Finance Department shall oversee the 6 project described herein.

7 Section 6. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become 8 effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective 9 without the Mayor's signature.
