the funds awarded for year one of the three-year grant and covers the period beginning December 1, 2024 through November 30, 2025. The overall grant term is three (3) years beginning December 1, 2024 and ending November 30, 2027. A copy of the State of Florida Department of Children and Families Standard Contract (#LH874) has been placed **On File** with the Legislative Services Division. No City match is required.

Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 1 is to provide additional funds for the Mental Health and Adult Drug Court in the Fourth Judicial Circuit, specifically, Clay County. The funding will provide substance abuse treatment, mental health treatment services, and evaluation services for the Mental Health and Adult Drug Court participants in Clay County.

Section 3. Carryover. The funds appropriated in this Ordinance shall not lapse but shall carry over to fiscal year 2025-2026.

Section 4. Oversight. The Court Administration, Director of Problem Solving Courts shall oversee the administration of the Grant described herein, including providing reporting required by the terms of the Grant.
