A RESOLUTION HONORING AND COMMENDING NATHANIEL "NAT" GLOVER, JR. FOR HIS RECEIPT OF THE PRESIDENT'S LIFETIME ACHIEVEMENT AWARD ΙN RECOGNITION LIFELONG OF HIS COMMITMENT TO BUILDING A STRONGER NATION THROUGH VOLUNTEER SERVICE; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

Glover, WHEREAS, Nathaniel "Nat" Jr. is native Jacksonville who has dedicated his life to service in many forms, with a particular focus on service to the Jacksonville community both through his distinguished career in law enforcement and in the area of higher education; and

Mr. Glover's career with the Jacksonville Sheriff's WHEREAS, Office began in 1966 when he joined JSO as a patrol officer, later working his way up through the ranks until he was ultimately elected as Sheriff in 1995 and served two terms in that office; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Glover retired from the Jacksonville Sheriff's Office in 2003 marking the conclusion of 37 years of distinguished service in law enforcement which he followed by taking on various roles in higher education, including serving as interim president at his alma mater, Edward Waters College (now Edward Waters University) beginning in 2010, and being appointed to the permanent position as the 29th present of the College during the following year; and

WHEREAS, Nat Glover has been a devoted mentor, coach and role model who leads and serves with the intent of helping people achieve

and to strive to go beyond their own expectations and the expectations of others; and

successes and positions that will allow them to serve meritoriously

WHEREAS, Mr. Glover has received various recognitions and awards throughout his lifetime that honor not only his personal and professional achievements, but his unwavering dedication to his community and the people he has served; and

WHEREAS, this year, Nat Glover received an honor of the highest distinction when he was awarded the Presidential Lifetime Achievement Award which was created in 2003 to honor individuals whose service positively impacts communities in every corner of the nation and inspires those around them to also take action to serve; and

WHEREAS, recipients of the Presidential Lifetime Achievement
Award have dedicated at least 4,000 hours of unpaid volunteer service
over the course of their lives to benefit others; and

WHEREAS, in recognition of Nat Glover's receipt of this most distinguished honor, the City Council desires to join the President of the United States in his recognition of Mr. Glover's service to the City and the people of Jacksonville; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. The City Council hereby honors and commends Nathaniel "Nat" Glover, Jr. for his receipt of the 2024 President's Lifetime Achievement Award in recognition of his lifetime commitment to building a stronger nation through volunteer service. The City Council extends its congratulations to Mr. Glover on receiving this honor and commends him for his dedicated service to the City and the entire Jacksonville community. The Council also wishes to express its gratitude for the significant positive impact Nat Glover has had on the community to which he has given so generously.
