• Discussion on Land Swap vs. Purchase of 801 W. Bay St.

Council Member Salem spoke about his resolution being filed this week that directs City Administration and the Downtown Investment Authority to immediately begin negotiations with Gateway for a direct purchase of 801 W. Bay Street, and a directive to abandon efforts to pursue the acquisition of the Property via a land swap.

Ms. Boyer, DIA, talked about the timeline, with a target date of May 27th for a committee of the whole meeting.

CM Lahnen asked about the overall cost for the UF project.

CM Howland expressed concern about the source of financing, noting that if funds go towards the UF project funds should be decreased elsewhere for other priorities.

CM Salem asked for specific names of the players in this deal.

• Update on JFRD Homelessness Initiative

Chief Powers spoke about the impact of the PATH program and a roughly 49 percent reduction in the homeless population count. He said that the Salvation Army shelter opened this week. Chief Powers said the PATH team has had 562 encounters with folks living unsheltered on the streets. Jimmy Ricks, JSO, said that there have been 775 warnings issued for public camping, 198 arrests, and 149 Homeward Bound participants this year (242 last year). CM Pittman asked about property storage and the path to stable permanent housing. CM Freeman asked about the impact on the program if there is no budget increase in October. CM Arias asked if the homeless situation can be categorized as a crisis.

• Council Auditor Kim Taylor to discuss:

1. Report #832B: Follow-Up on Real Estate Audit: Ms. Taylor talked about the follow up report for the Real Estate audit. She said that there were still some uncorrected items, including 168 properties lot listed as capital assets, and surplus properties not sold timely.

2. Report #805B: Follow-up on Building Inspection Division Audit: Ms. Taylor said that there were issues in this audit related to access rights and SOP updates. CM Lahnen expressed concerns about issues being unresolved.

Council Member Pittman declared a voting abstention.

Council Member Lahnen spoke on behalf of the bill and offered an amendment to set the maximum award at \$125,000 per category. Motion/2nd: Lahnen/Diamond. Approved unanimously.

Council Member Arias spoke about several ideas he had for additional amendments to limit the frequency and amount of awards per category per applicant, set a cap for awards in a 5 year period and then not be allowed to re-apply for a year, and PSG recipients may not receive other direct contracts with the City.

There was discussion about CM Arias' suggestions. CM Lahnen said that the ideas need further contemplation and should be put on hold until after this year's PSG grant cycle. CM Howland talked about future fiscal uncertainty. Council Member Salem said that a special committee should be formed to do a deeper dive into the PSG process, involving the providers.

Motion/2nd Arias/Freeman to amend to provide that requesting agencies shall be eligible to receive only one public service grant per fiscal year and that a single requesting agency shall select which program receives the award in the event that multiple applications meet the applicable requirements. Approved 4-2 (Salem and Lahnen in opposition)
