Bill Summary: This bill establishes the Fiscal Year 2025-2026 Allocation of Funding Percentages for the Opioid Settlement Proceeds Funded Categories and the Fiscal Year 2025-2026 Opioid Settlement Proceeds Grant Application Process, in accordance with Chapter 84 (Opioid Settlement Proceeds Grants), Ordinance Code.

Background Information: The purpose of this legislation is to allocate funding from the Opioid Settlement Proceeds Grants for FY 2025-2026, ensuring that funds are directed toward prevention, treatment, and recovery support. The legislation also formalizes the grant application process for the fiscal year. The allocations and procedures follow the recommendations of the OSUD Grants Committee, which is responsible for reviewing and guiding the use of opioid settlement funds in Jacksonville.

The Opioid and Substance Use Disorder (OSUD) Grants Committee met on January 27, 2025, to approve funding allocation percentages and on February 24, 2025, to approve the grant application process.

The Opioid Settlement Proceeds Funded categories for FY 2025-2026 are allocated as follows:

- Prevention: 34%
- Treatment: 33%
- Recovery Support: 33%

Additionally, any excess funds within a category may be reallocated to another category that is underfunded, based on a percentage distribution formula.
