A RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING THE VETERANS OF FOREIGN WARS POST 4761 CELEBRATION OF MAY 22, 2025, AS VETERANS OF FOREIGN WARS REMEMBRANCE DAY AND RECOGNIZING THE EFFORTS OF VETERANS OF FOREIGN WARS POST 4761 TO HONOR THE SERVICE OF VETERANS RISKED THEIR LIVES DEFENDING INCLUDING BY GIFTING A MONUMENT TO NEW STANTON SENIOR HIGH SCHOOL AND STANTON COLLEGE PREPARATORY SCHOOL TO HONOR STUDENT VETERANS; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, with 1.5 million members located in over 6,000 Posts worldwide, the Veterans of Foreign Wars and its Auxiliary are dedicated to veterans' services, legislative advocacy, and community programs; and

WHEREAS, founded in 1899 by veterans of the Spanish-American War and the Philippine Insurrection, the Veterans of Foreign Wars' mission through the years has focused on securing rights and benefits for veterans; and

WHEREAS, Veterans of Foreign Wars Post 4761 ("VFW Post 4761") works throughout the year to empower veterans, recognize service and patriotism, and build community; and

WHEREAS, the General Daniel "Chappie" James Post 4761 in Jacksonville was organized on October 5, 1991, and named as an homage to the life and military career of General Daniel "Chappie" James, who in 1975 became the first African American officer in the history

of the United States military to attain the rank of four-star General; and

WHEREAS, on May 25, 2023, the Veterans of Foreign Wars Post 4761 gifted a monument to New Stanton Senior High School and Stanton College Preparatory School to honor student veterans who served in World War II, the Korean War, the Vietnam War and in Afghanistan. The inscription states: "The Veterans of Our Military Service have put their lives on the line to protect the freedom that we enjoy. They have dedicated their lives to their country and deserve to be recognized for their commitment."; and

WHEREAS, included amongst the student veterans honored and recognized by the VFW Post 4761 monument is Stanton College Preparatory School graduate Army Seargeant Wakkuna Almira Jackson who enlisted to save money for medical school but was tragically killed in action on August 19, 2006, in Kunar, Afghanistan at age 21; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. The City of Jacksonville does hereby join Veterans of Foreign Wars Post 4761 in their celebration of May 22, 2025, as Veterans of Foreign Wars Remembrance Day. The City Council appreciates the efforts by the Veterans of Foreign Wars Post 4761 to preserve the memories of fallen heroes who gave their lives defending freedom on battlefields across the globe.

Section 2. Effective Date. This Resolution shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
