6 A RESOLUTION CONCERNING THE PROPOSED AD VALOREM
7 TAX MILLAGE RATES FOR THE 2022 TAX YEAR;
8 ADVISING THE PROPERTY APPRAISER OF THE "ROLLED-
9 BACK RATE" AND PROPOSED MILLAGE RATES FOR THE
10 GENERAL SERVICES DISTRICT, EXCEPTING URBAN
11 SERVICES DISTRICTS 2 THROUGH 5 (THE BEACHES AND
12 THE TOWN OF BALDWIN), FOR THE GENERAL SERVICES
13 DISTRICT, INCLUDING ONLY URBAN SERVICES
14 DISTRICTS 2, 3, AND 4 (THE BEACHES), AND FOR THE
15 GENERAL SERVICES DISTRICT, INCLUDING ONLY URBAN
16 SERVICES DISTRICT 5 (THE TOWN OF BALDWIN);
17 SETTING THE DATE, TIME AND PLACE FOR A PUBLIC
18 HEARING TO CONSIDER THE PROPOSED 2022 MILLAGE
19 RATES AND THE TENTATIVE CONSOLIDATED GOVERNMENT
20 BUDGET FOR THE 2022-2023 FISCAL YEAR; REQUESTING
21 EMERGENCY PASSAGE; DIRECTING THE CHIEF OF
22 LEGISLATIVE SERVICES TO DELIVER A COPY OF THIS
23 RESOLUTION TO THE PROPERTY APPRAISER UPON
24 ADOPTION; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

26 **WHEREAS**, the Property Appraiser has certified to the Council the
27 taxable value of real property within the City's taxing jurisdiction,
28 which certification was provided by July 1, 2022; and

29 **WHEREAS**, Section 200.065, *Florida Statutes*, requires that the
30 Council advise the Property Appraiser of the "rolled-back rate," of
31 the proposed millage rate and of the date of a public hearing on the

1 proposed rates and the tentative budget within thirty-five days of
2 the certification by the Property Appraiser; now, therefore

3 **BE IT RESOLVED** by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

4 **Section 1. 2022 Rolled-back Rate Established.** Based upon
5 the certified taxable values provided by the Property Appraiser, the
6 Council has computed and hereby establishes that the "rolled-back
7 rate" of millage under Section 200.065(1), *Florida Statutes*, is
8 10.3761 mills, or \$10.3761 per \$1,000 assessed taxable value, for the
9 General Services District, excepting Urban Services Districts 2
10 through 5 (the Beaches and the Town of Baldwin); is 7.3813 mills, or
11 \$7.3813 per \$1,000 assessed taxable value, for the General Services
12 District, including only Urban Services Districts 2, 3, and 4 (the
13 Beaches); and is 8.8504 mills, or \$8.8504 per \$1,000 assessed taxable
14 value, for the General Services District, including only Urban
15 Services District 5 (the Town of Baldwin).

16 **Section 2. Proposed 2022 Millage Rates.** Based upon the
17 certified taxable values stated in Section 1, and upon consideration
18 of public spirited and competing community interests, the Council
19 proposes to levy millage rates for the 2022 tax year as follows:

20 **2022 PROPOSED MILLAGE RATES**

21 **General Services District, excepting Urban Services Districts 2**
22 **through 5 (the Beaches and the Town of Baldwin)**
23 11.3169 mills (operations), or \$11.3169 per \$1,000 of assessed taxable
24 value;

25 **General Services District, including only Urban Services Districts**
26 **2, 3, and 4 (the Beaches)**
27 8.0262 mills (operations), or \$8.0262 per \$1,000 of assessed taxable
28 value;

29 **General Services District, including only Urban Services District 5**
30 **(the Town of Baldwin):**
31 9.526 mills (operations), or \$9.526 per \$1,000 of assessed taxable

1 value;

2 **Section 3. Date, Time and Place for Public Hearing.** The
3 Council will hold a public hearing to consider the proposed 2022
4 millage rates and the tentative Consolidated Government budget on
5 September 13, 2022, at 5:01 p.m. in the Council Chambers, 1st Floor,
6 City Hall, at 117 West Duval Street, Jacksonville, Florida.

7 **Section 4. Requesting Emergency Passage Pursuant to Council**
8 **Rule 4.901 Emergency.** Emergency passage of this resolution is
9 requested. The nature of the emergency is the requirement, pursuant
10 to Section 200.065(2)(b), *Florida Statutes*, that the Council advise
11 the Property Appraiser of the "rolled-back rate," of the proposed
12 millage rates, and of the date of a public hearing on the proposed
13 rates and tentative budget within thirty-five days of the
14 certification by the Property Appraiser.

15 **Section 5. Delivery to the Property Appraiser.** The Chief
16 of Legislative Services shall, upon approval of this Resolution,
17 forthwith deliver a fully executed copy of this Resolution to the
18 Duval County Property Appraiser.

19 **Section 6. Effective Date.** This Resolution shall become
20 effective upon signature by the Council President.
