5 A RESOLUTION CONFIRMING THE COUNCIL PRESIDENT'S
6 APPOINTMENT OF CHERYL CROFT, A DUVAL COUNTY
7 RESIDENT, AS A SUPERVISOR MEMBER OF THE FIVE
8 POINTS DEPENDENT SPECIAL DISTRICT BOARD OF
9 SUPERVISORS IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE CHARTER OF
10 THE FIVE POINTS DEPENDENT SPECIAL DISTRICT,
11 ESTABLISHED BY ORDINANCE 2025-539-E, FOR AN
12 INITIAL TWO-YEAR TERM; REQUESTING ONE CYCLE
13 EMERGENCY PASSAGE; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.
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15 **WHEREAS**, Section 189.02, *Florida Statutes*, provides that the
16 City Council may create dependent special districts for the purpose
17 of delivering essential services to specific areas within the City;
18 and

19 **WHEREAS** on October 28, 2025, the City Council enacted Ordinance
20 2025-539-E creating the Five Points Dependent Special District (the
21 "District") and establishing the Charter of the District, which was
22 created to provide continuing services that include, but are not
23 limited to, the provision of elevated levels of security, landscaping
24 and promotion within the geographic boundaries of the District; and

25 **WHEREAS**, the District's Charter established the Board of
26 Supervisors as the District's governing body, comprised of five
27 Supervisors and three Alternates, each appointed to serve two-year
28 terms; and

29 **WHEREAS**, pursuant to Section 6(b), of the District Charter,
30 three Supervisors and two Alternates shall be appointed by the Council
31 President and confirmed by the City Council, and two Supervisors and

one Alternate shall be appointed by the Mayor and confirmed by the City Council; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Confirmation of Appointment. The Council hereby confirms the Council President's appointment of Cheryl Croft, a Duval County resident, as a Supervisor member of the Five Points Dependent Special District Board of Supervisors in accordance with the Charter of the Five Points Dependent Special District, for an initial two-year term.

Section 2. Requesting One Cycle Emergency Passage Pursuant to Council Rule 4.901 Emergency. One cycle emergency passage of this legislation is requested. The nature of the emergency is the desire for the Board to be fully seated in order to commence their work in a timely manner, including the development of an annual budget prior to the April 1st deadline.

Section 3. Effective Date. This Resolution shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
