Bill Summary: This bill confirms the Council President's appointment of Ashley Kendrick to the Five Points Dependent Special District Board of Supervisors, as an Alternate member, for an initial two-year term. One cycle emergency passage of this legislation is requested so the Board may be fully seated in order to commence their work in a timely manner.

Background Information: Ordinance 2025-539-E created the Five Points Dependent Special District to provide continuing services that include, but are not limited to, the provision of elevated levels of security, landscaping and promotion within the geographic boundaries of the District. The District's Charter established the Board of Supervisors as the governing body, comprised of five Supervisors and three Alternates, each appointed to serve two-year terms. Three Supervisors and two Alternates shall be appointed by the Council President and confirmed by the City Council, and two Supervisors and one Alternate shall be appointed by the Mayor and confirmed by the City Council.

Ms. Kendrick is working towards her bachelor's degree from Florida State College at Jacksonville. She is the owner of Malachi's Ice Cream Bar in the 5 Points District. Ms. Kendrick resides in Duval County in council district 7.
