5 AN ORDINANCE REGARDING OPIOID AND SUBSTANCE USE  
6 DISORDER SETTLEMENT PROCEEDS GRANTS;  
7 APPROPRIATING \$4,768,478 FROM THE OPIOID  
8 SETTLEMENT FUND CONTINGENCY ACCOUNT TO THE  
9 OPIOID SETTLEMENT FUND - SUBSIDIES AND  
10 CONTRIBUTIONS TO PRIVATE ORGANIZATIONS ACCOUNT  
11 TO FUND OPIOID AND SUBSTANCE USE DISORDER  
12 SETTLEMENT PROCEEDS GRANTS ("OSUD GRANTS");  
13 PROVIDING FOR CITY OVERSIGHT BY THE OPIOID  
14 ABATEMENT MANAGER WITHIN THE JACKSONVILLE FIRE  
15 AND RESCUE DEPARTMENT; WAIVING THE CONFLICTING  
16 PROVISION OF SECTION 84.301 (OPIOID SETTLEMENT  
17 PROCEEDS ALLOCATION FOR OPIOID SETTLEMENT  
18 PROCEEDS GRANTS), PART 3 (OPIOID SETTLEMENT  
19 PROCEEDS GRANT AWARD PROCEDURES), CHAPTER 84  
20 (OPIOID SETTLEMENT PROCEEDS GRANTS), *ORDINANCE*  
21 *CODE*, TO APPROVE THE LUMP SUM APPROPRIATION FOR  
22 OSUD GRANTS BY SEPARATE LEGISLATION FROM THE  
23 ANNUAL BUDGET ORDINANCE; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE  
24 DATE.

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26 **BE IT ORDAINED** by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

27 **Section 1. Appropriation.** For the 2024-2025 fiscal year,  
28 within the City's budget, there are hereby appropriated the indicated  
29 sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to the account(s)  
30 listed in subsection (b):

6 (c) Explanation of Appropriation:

7 The funding above is an appropriation from the designated  
8 Opioid Settlement Fund Contingency account to the Opioid  
9 Settlement Fund - Subsidies and Contributions to Private  
10 Organizations account to fund Opioid and Substance Use  
11 Disorder Settlement Proceeds Grants ("OSUD Grants").

12 **Section 2. Purpose.** The OSUD Grant appropriation shall be  
13 allocated to the Prevention (34%), Treatment (33%) and Recovery  
14 Support (33%) categories as outlined and approved in Ordinance  
15 2024-251-E, shall be used solely for the purpose of the listed Opioid  
16 and Substance Use Disorder Settlement Proceeds Grant categories and  
17 may not be transferred or reallocated for any other utilization within  
18 the respective department. OSUD Grants are subject to the provisions  
19 of Chapter 84, *Ordinance Code*. The appropriation made herein shall  
20 be awarded as grants-in-aid to miscellaneous agencies and shall not  
21 require additional legislation for distribution of funds. Pursuant  
22 to Section 118.808, *Ordinance Code*, the Opioid and Substance Use  
23 Disorder Grants Committee shall forward a complete list of the OSUD  
24 Grants recipients and funding allocations to the Council Auditor's  
25 Office, the Office of the Mayor, the City Council, and the Director  
26 of the Finance Department.

27 **Section 3. Oversight.** The Manager of Opioid Abatement  
28 within the Jacksonville Fire and Rescue Department shall oversee the  
29 grants described herein.

30 **Section 4. Waiving Conflicting Provision of Section 84.301,**  
31 **Ordinance Code.** The conflicting provision of Section 84.301 (Opioid

1 Settlement Proceeds Allocation for Opioid Settlement Proceeds  
2 Grants), Part 3 (Opioid Settlement Proceeds Grant Award Procedures),  
3 Chapter 84 (Opioid Settlement Proceeds Grants), *Ordinance Code*,  
4 requiring this appropriation to be included in the Mayor's annual  
5 budget is hereby waived. Waiver of Section 84.301, *Ordinance Code*,  
6 is necessary because the OSUD Grant lump sum appropriation for the  
7 2024-2025 annual budget will be considered and acted upon by Council  
8 by this Ordinance 2024-510 and not in the annual budget Ordinance  
9 2024-504.

10 **Section 5. Effective Date.** This Ordinance shall become  
11 effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective  
12 without the Mayor's signature.
