

## Business Impact Estimate

Proposed ordinance's title/reference: AN ORDINANCE REGARDING CHAPTER 745 (ADDRESSING AND STREET NAMING REGULATIONS) ORDINANCE CODE; TO RE-NAME WEAVER ROAD EXTENDING FROM AVENUE "B" TO A DEAD END AS "CHARLIE E. MCCLENDON ROAD" IN COUNCIL DISTRICT 8; RECOGNIZING THE ACHIEVEMENTS OF CHARLIE E. MCCLENDON; WAIVER OF SECTION 745.105(1)(2), ORDINANCE CODE, WHICH REQUIRES THAT A PERSON BE DECEASED FOR AT LEAST FIVE YEARS; DIRECTING THE LEGISLATIVE SERVICES DIVISION TO FORWARD THIS ORDINANCE TO THE PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT FOR PROCESSING, IMPLEMENTATION, AND COORDINATION WITH THE PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT, TRAFFIC ENGINEERING DIVISION, 911 EMERGENCY, FIRE AND RESCUE DEPARTMENT, THE POST OFFICE AND OTHER AFFECTED AGENCIES AND ORGANIZATIONS; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

Summary of the proposed ordinance (must include a statement of the public purpose, such as serving the public health, safety, morals, and welfare):

The ordinance involves a street re-naming of Weaver Road to Charlie E. McClendon Road. The purpose of the street re-naming is to honor the well known minister Charles E. McClendon, due to his generosity, teachings and contributions to the community and the church that he ministers.
