APPROPRIATING \$986,000.00, ΑN ORDINANCE INCLUDING (1) \$493,000.00 FROM THE PROJECT TITLED NUNGEZER ROAD TO THE PROJECT TITLED SAN MATEO ELEMENTARY SCHOOL SIDEWALK ("SAN MATEO PROJECT") TO PAY FOR THE COMPLETION OF THE SAN MATEO PROJECT, AND (2) \$493,000.00 FROM THE AUTHORIZED CAPITAL PROJECTS FUND TO THE LOCAL OPTION AND CONSTITUTIONAL GAS TAXES FUND WITH RESPECT TO THE CEDAR POINT/SAWPIT ROAD BERLIN TO SHARK) PROJECT ("CEDAR POINT PROJECT" AND TOGETHER WITH THE SAN MATEO PROJECT, THE "PROJECTS"), AND UPDATING PRIOR APPROPRIATIONS TO REFLECT ACTUALS, AS INITIATED BY B.T. 24-140; 2024-2028 FIVE-YEAR AMENDING THECAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PLAN APPROVED BY ORDINANCE 2023-505-E TO REFLECT THIS APPROPRIATION OF FUNDS TO THE PROJECTS; PROVIDING FOR OVERSIGHT BY THE ENGINEERING AND CONSTRUCTION MANAGEMENT DIVISION OF THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Appropriation. For the 2023-2024 fiscal year, within the City's budget, there is hereby appropriated the indicated sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to the account(s) listed in subsection (b):

by this reference)

(c) Explanation of Appropriation:

The funding above represents an appropriation of \$986,000.00, including (1) \$493,000.00 from the project titled Nungezer Road ("Nungezer Project") to the project titled San Mateo Elementary School Sidewalk ("San Mateo Project") to provide funding to complete the San Mateo Project which includes the construction of approximately 3,500 feet of sidewalk along Eastport Road from Main Street to Aaron Road, crossing CSX railroad tracks, and (2) \$493,000.00 from the Authorized Capital Projects Fund to the Local Option and Constitutional Gas Taxes Fund with respect to the Cedar Point/Sawpit Road (New Berlin To Shark) Project ("Cedar Point Project" and together with the San Mateo Project, the "Projects"), and also updating prior appropriations to reflect actuals.

Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 1 is to allocate funds from the Nungezer Project to the San Mateo Project and transfer \$493,000.00 between funds with respect to the Cedar Point Project. The San Mateo Project provides approximately 3,500 feet of sidewalk along Eastport Road from Main Street to Aaron Road, crossing CSX railroad tracks, including a crosswalk improvement to aid students walking north of Eastport Road towards San Mateo Elementary. The Cedar Point Project provides widening, milling and resurfacing Sawpit Road from Cedar Point to Shark Road. This reallocation of funds and appropriation is necessary to allow for the completion of the Projects. In addition, the appropriation updates

prior appropriations to reflect actuals.

Section 3. Capital Improvement Plan Amendment. Ordinance 2023-505-E, adopting the 2024-2028 Five-Year Capital Improvement Plan (the "CIP") for the City and certain of its independent agencies, is hereby amended to modify the scope of the San Mateo Project and appropriate funds to the Projects as more fully described in the Project Information Sheets attached hereto as Exhibit 2, and incorporated herein by this reference. The City Council finds that the deferral of this amendment of the CIP until the next annual budget and CIP review will be detrimental to the best interests of the community because such deferral will unnecessarily delay completion of the Projects.

Pursuant to Section 122.605(c), Ordinance Code, enactment of this Ordinance requires the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the City Council members present at the meeting because of the CIP amendment set forth in this section. This Ordinance shall constitute an amendment to Ordinance 2023-505-E. In all other respects, the Five-Year Capital Improvement Plan approved by Ordinance 2023-505-E shall remain unchanged and continue in full force and effect.

Section 4. Oversight. The Engineering and Construction Management Division of the Department of Public Works shall have oversight in the projects described herein.

Section 5. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
