AN ORDINANCE REGARDING CHAPTER 745 (ADDRESSING 4 5 AND STREET NAMING REGULATIONS) ORDINANCE CODE; ESTABLISHING AN HONORARY STREET DESIGNATION AND 6 7 ASSOCIATED ROADWAY MARKERS FOR DOCTOR ANDREW 8 BROOKER COLEMAN, JR.; ESTABLISHING AN HONORARY 9 STREET DESIGNATION ON MONCRIEF ROAD EXTENDING FROM VOORHIES STREET TO MEHARRY STREET 10 ΙN 11 COUNCIL DISTRICT 10 FOR DOCTOR ANDREW BROOKER COLEMAN, JR.; PROVIDING FOR THE INSTALLATION OF 12 13 TWO HONORARY ROADWAY MARKERS TO BE LOCATED IN APPROPRIATE LOCATIONS ON THE DESIGNATED ROAD IN 14 15 COUNCIL DISTRICT 10; WAIVER OF SECTION 745.105 (I) (3) WHICH REQUIRES THAT THE HONOREE LIVE IN 16 17 THE COMMUNITY WITHIN FIVE MILES OF THE STREET BEING DESIGNATED FOR AT LEAST 10 18 YEARS; DIRECTING THE LEGISLATIVE SERVICES DIVISION TO 19 20 FORWARD THIS ORDINANCE TO THE PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT, ADDRESSING DIVISION FOR 21 22 PROCESSING, IMPLEMENTATION AND COORDINATION 23 WITH THE PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT, TRAFFIC 24 ENGINEERING AND OTHER AFFECTED AGENCIES AND 25 ORGANIZATIONS; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

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WHEREAS, Dr. Andrew Brooker (A.B.) Coleman, Jr., born on the campus of Bethune Cookman College in Daytona Beach, Florida, passed away in Jacksonville in 2006; and

30 WHEREAS, Dr. Coleman graduated in 1946 from Stanton School in 31 Jacksonville; and WHEREAS, after high school, Dr. Coleman attended Benedict College, Howard University School of Religion, the Urban Institute, Luther Rice Seminary and the American Academy McAllister Institute of Mortuary Science; and

5 WHEREAS, Dr. Andrew Brooker Coleman, Jr. completed 20 years in 6 the United States Army and attended numerous military schools; and 7 WHEREAS, after successfully retiring from the United States 8 Army, Dr. Coleman embarked on a new profession in the funeral service 9 industry; and

10 WHEREAS, initially, in Washington, D.C., Dr. Coleman partnered 11 with his colleagues at the Johnson & Jenkins Funeral Home, Inc.; and 12 WHEREAS, after returning to his home state of Florida in 1972, 13 Dr. Andrew Brooker Coleman, Jr. opened A.B. Coleman Mortuary and 14 Cremation Service, Inc. which he proudly operated for 34 years in the 15 Jacksonville community; and

16 WHEREAS, in 1972, Dr. Coleman was ordained as the lead pastor 17 of the St. Andrew Missionary Baptist Church; and

18 WHEREAS, during his lifetime, Dr. Coleman volunteered in 19 numerous religious and civil affairs, to name a few: Chairman of the 20 Board of Trustees for Florida Memorial University, Former Chairman, 21 Board of Directors of the Florida General Baptist Convention, Former 22 Chairman of the Board of Funeral Directors and Embalmers, State of 23 Former President of Florida First Coast Mortician Florida, 24 Association of Duval County, Former President of the Baptist Ministers Conference of Jacksonville, Duval and surrounding counties; and 25

WHEREAS, Dr. Coleman was also appointed to the Jacksonville Economic Development Council, and served as a member of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People and the Urban League; and

30 WHEREAS, Dr. Coleman was a Life Member of his beloved Alpha Phi
31 Alpha fraternity, Sigma Pi Phi Fraternity, Gamma Beta Boule' and the

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Prince Hall 33rd Degree Mason; and

2 WHEREAS, the Florida Memorial University Trustees as well as the 3 Worldwide School of Missions awarded Dr. Coleman Honorary Degrees; 4 and

5 WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 745.105 (j)(10), Ordinance Code, the Planning and Development Department mailed written notifications 6 7 on May 15, 2023, and on June 15, 2023, to 12 affected property owners requesting the affected property owners to indicate their written 8 9 consent or objection to the proposed honorary street designation. A copy of the first and second written notifications and a complete 10 11 listing of the 12 total affected addresses are attached as Exhibits 12 1, 2 and 3; and

WHEREAS, three (3) affected property owners indicated their consent of the proposed honorary designation. Note that one of the aforementioned three (3) property owners owns six (6) of the 12 total affected properties on the designated street. Copies of the written consents are attached as **Exhibit 4**; and

18 WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 745.105 (j)(10), Ord. Code, the 19 remaining affected property owners are deemed to have consented to 20 the proposed honorary designations due to their non-response to the 21 written notifications; and

WHEREAS, the applicant remitted the required funds to satisfy the cost for the honorary markers. A payment receipt is attached as Exhibit 5. A completed application is also attached as Exhibit 6; and

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BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Moncrief Road Avenue to receive an honorary street designation for Dr. Andrew Brooker Coleman, Jr. "Moncrief Road" extending from Voorhies Street to Meharry Street in Council District 10, is hereby designated as contemplated by Section 745.105, Ordinance Code, for Dr. Andrew Brooker Coleman, Jr. A map of the road designation is attached hereto as Exhibit 7.

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Section 2. Honorary Roadside Markers for Dr. Andrew Brooker
 Coleman, Jr. to be installed. Two honorary roadside markers, as
 contemplated by Section 745.105, Ordinance Code, recognizing and
 honoring Dr. Andrew Brooker Coleman, Jr. shall be placed in
 appropriate locations on Moncrief Road.

6 Section 3. Waiver of Section 745.105 (i)(3), Ordinance 7 Code. Section 745.105(i)(3) which requires that the honoree live in 8 the community within five miles of the designated road for at least 9 10 years is hereby waived because Dr. Coleman, successfully, operated 10 the former, A.B. Coleman Mortuary on the designated road for more 11 than 34 years.

12 Section 4. Directing Legislative Services Division to 13 forward a copy to the Planning and Development Department. The Chief 14 of Legislative Services is requested to send a copy of this 15 legislation, once enacted, to the Planning and Development Department, Addressing Unit, for processing, implementation, and 16 17 coordination with the Public Works Department, Traffic Engineering 18 Division, the applicant and other affected agencies and 19 organizations.

20 Section 5. Effective Date. This ordinance shall 21 become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming 22 effective without the Mayor's signature.
